## **RESOLUTION NO. 2025-003**

## RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY OF SAN LEANDRO'S INTENT TO INITIATE PROCEDURES TO TRANSITION FROM AT-LARGE ELECTIONS TO DISTRICT-BASED ELECTIONS FOR CITY COUNCIL PURSUANT TO ELECTIONS CODE SECTION 10010; AND SETTING FORTH THE PROCESS FOR TRANSITIONING TO DISTRICT-BASED ELECTIONS

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to California Elections Code Section 14026, the City of San Leandro's election system is considered an "at-large" system because it utilizes a combination of "at-large" and "district-based" methods; and

**WHEREAS**, pursuant to City of San Leandro Charter Section 225, members of the City Council are elected in "at-large" elections, in which each City Councilmember is elected by the registered voters of the entire City; and

**WHEREAS**, any amendments to the City's Charter regarding its existing election system method requires a majority vote of the City's electorate through a ballot measure; and

**WHEREAS**, on November 21, 2024, the City of San Leandro ("City") received a letter from a prospective plaintiff's attorney alleging a violation of the California Voting Rights Act (the "CVRA") and signaling litigation if the City declines to voluntarily change to a district-based election system for electing Councilmembers; and

**WHEREAS**, the letter itself was not accompanied by any statistical evidence to support the claim of a CVRA violation; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council denies that its election system violates the CVRA or any other provision of law, asserts that the City's election system is legal in all respects, and further denies any wrongdoing whatsoever in connection with the manner in which at-large City Council elections have been conducted; and

**WHEREAS**, nevertheless, the City welcomes the views of its constituents as to whether or not the public interest is better served by initiating a process for transitioning to a district-based election system; and

**WHEREAS**, Elections Code Section 10010 provides a method whereby a jurisdiction can transition to a district-based election system and cap attorneys' fees under the CVRA if the jurisdiction complies with the "safe harbor" provisions of Elections Code Section 10010.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of San Leandro does **RESOLVE** as follows:

- 1. The above recitals are true and correct and are incorporated by reference herein.
- 2. The City Council hereby expresses its intent to consider transition from an at-large election system to a district-based election system as authorized by Elections Code Section 10010 for use in the City's election for City Councilmembers commencing in November 2026.
- 3. The City Clerk is directed to publicize and post information regarding the proposed transition to a

district-based election system, including relevant maps, notices, agendas and other information and to establish a means of communication to receive comments and answer questions from the public.

- 4. The City Council hereby approves the tentative timeline as set forth in Exhibit A, attached to and made a part of this resolution, for conducting public hearings to solicit and receive public input and testimony on proposed district-based electoral maps and district-based election systems, and for the City Council's evaluation, possible refinement and ultimate adoption of a district-based election system for election of City Council members.
- 5. The tentative timeline contained in Exhibit A may be adjusted by the City Manager as she deems necessary or appropriate, provided that such adjustments shall not prevent the City from complying with the time frames specified by Elections Code Section 10010, or such other timeframes as may be stipulated.
- 6. The City Council directs the City Manager to continue to work with the City Attorney to resolve all legal issues necessary to give effect to this Resolution and to meet the tentative timeline set forth in Exhibit A.
- 7. Nothing contained herein shall preclude the City Council from selecting an alternative election system or making any alternative decision, should the public input and testimony and other evidence at the hearings indicate that an alternative district map, election system, or decision is appropriate for the City.
- 8. The City Council should not on its own adopt an ordinance that converts the City's existing election system without first subjecting the proposal for voter approval.
- 9. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.
