# What?

Vision Zero is a Transportation safety policy to **eliminate** traffic related deaths and severe injuries on San Leandro streets.

Before		After
Traffic deaths are inevitable	➔	Traffic deaths are preventable
Prevent All Collisions	➔	Prevent Fatal and Severe Crashes
React to Collisions	➔	Proactively Identify and Address Risks

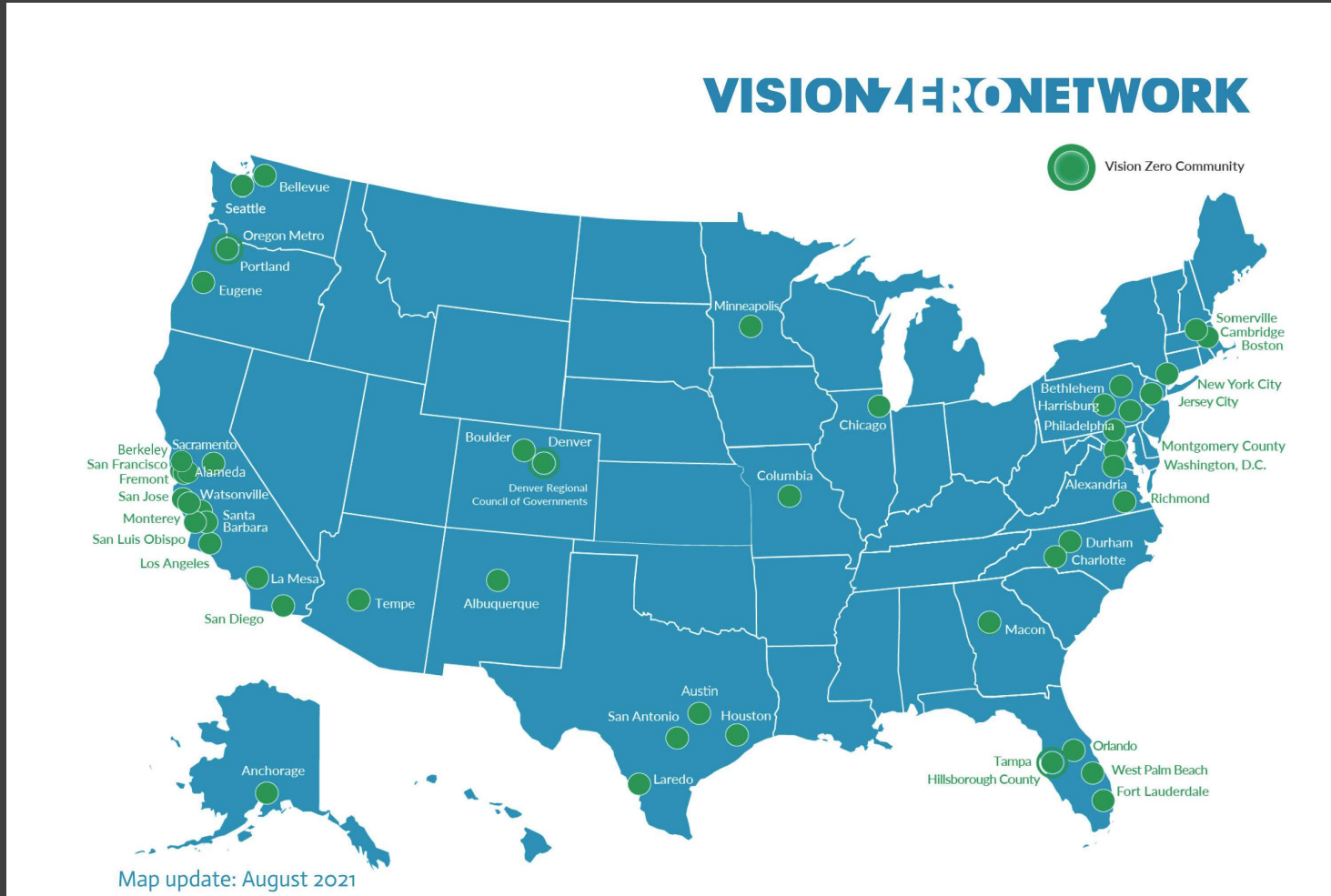

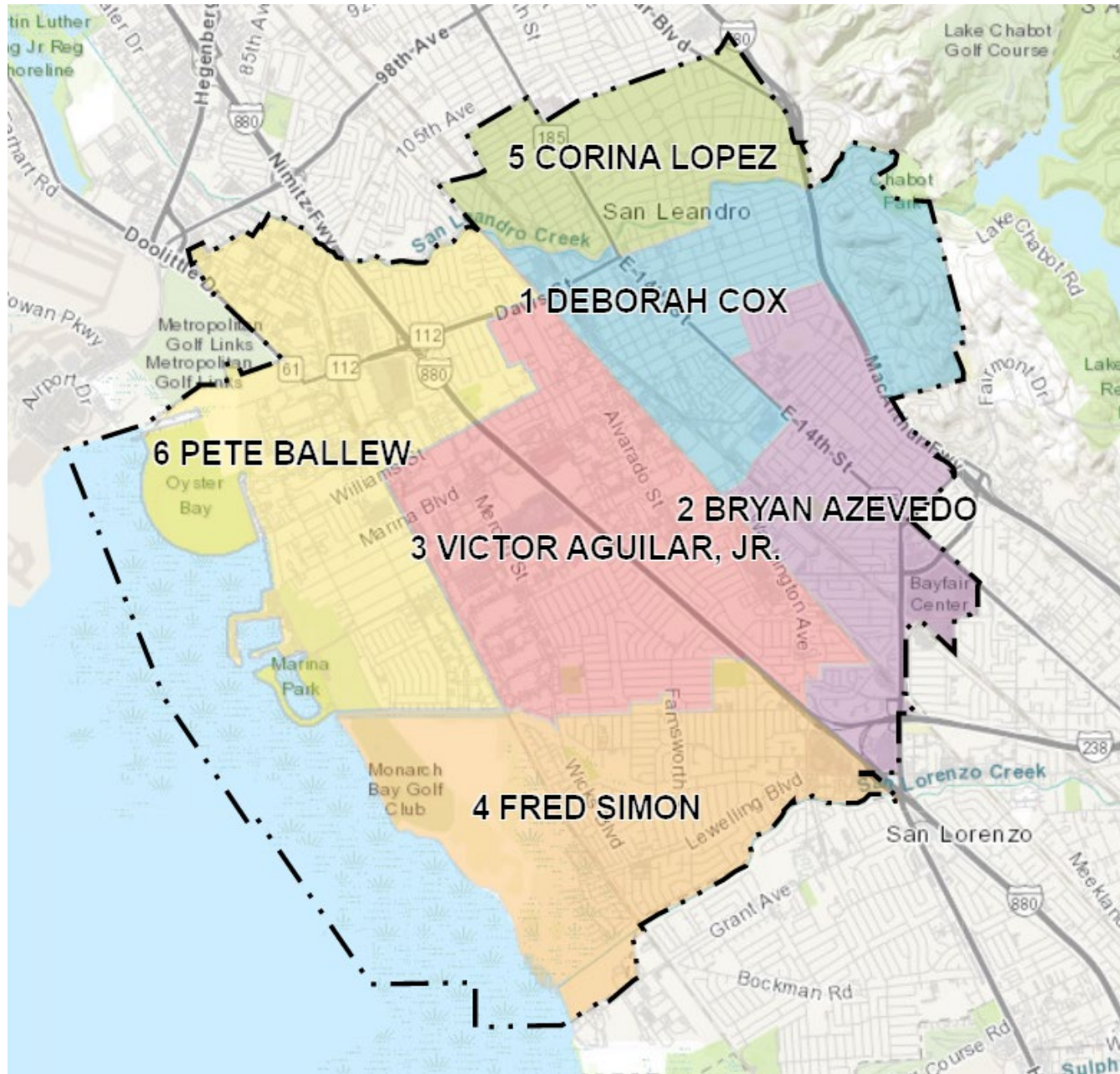
