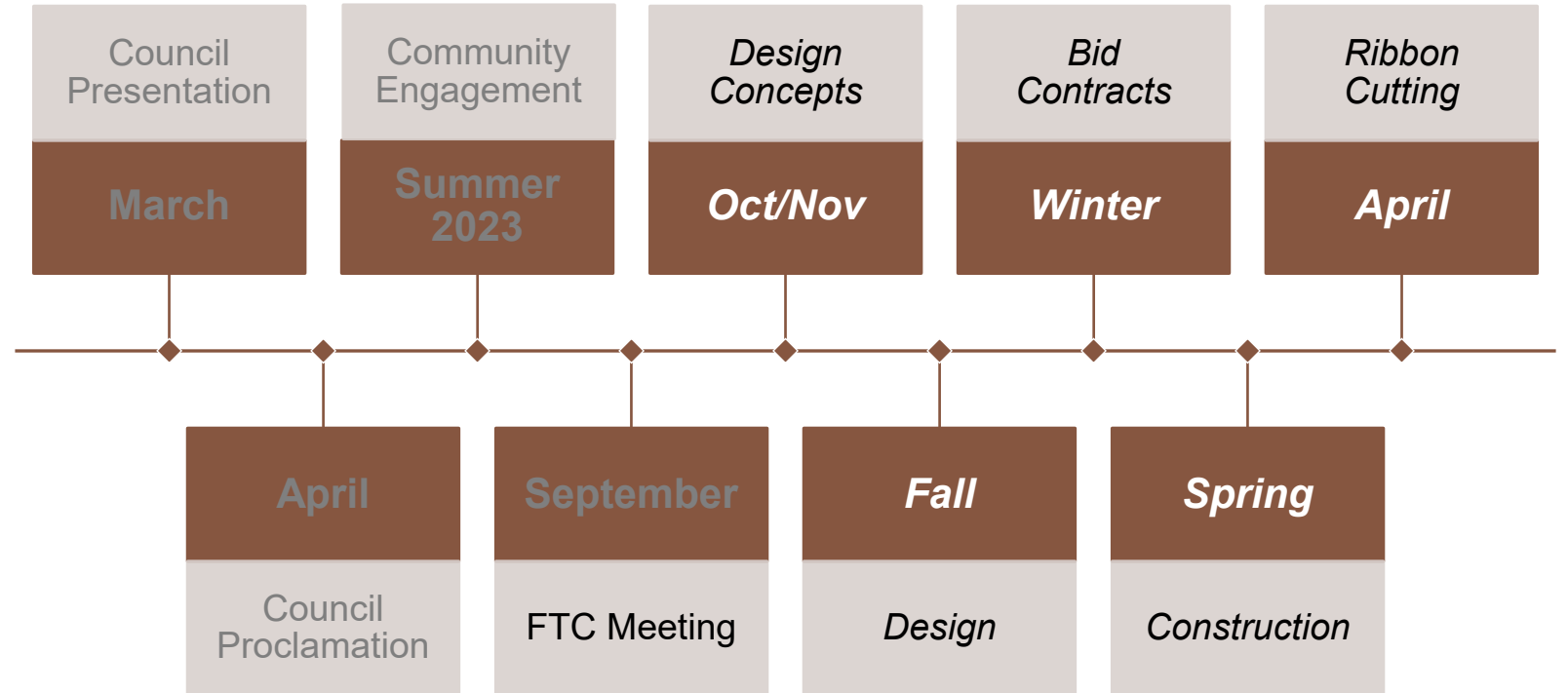
SITE LAYOUT PLAN

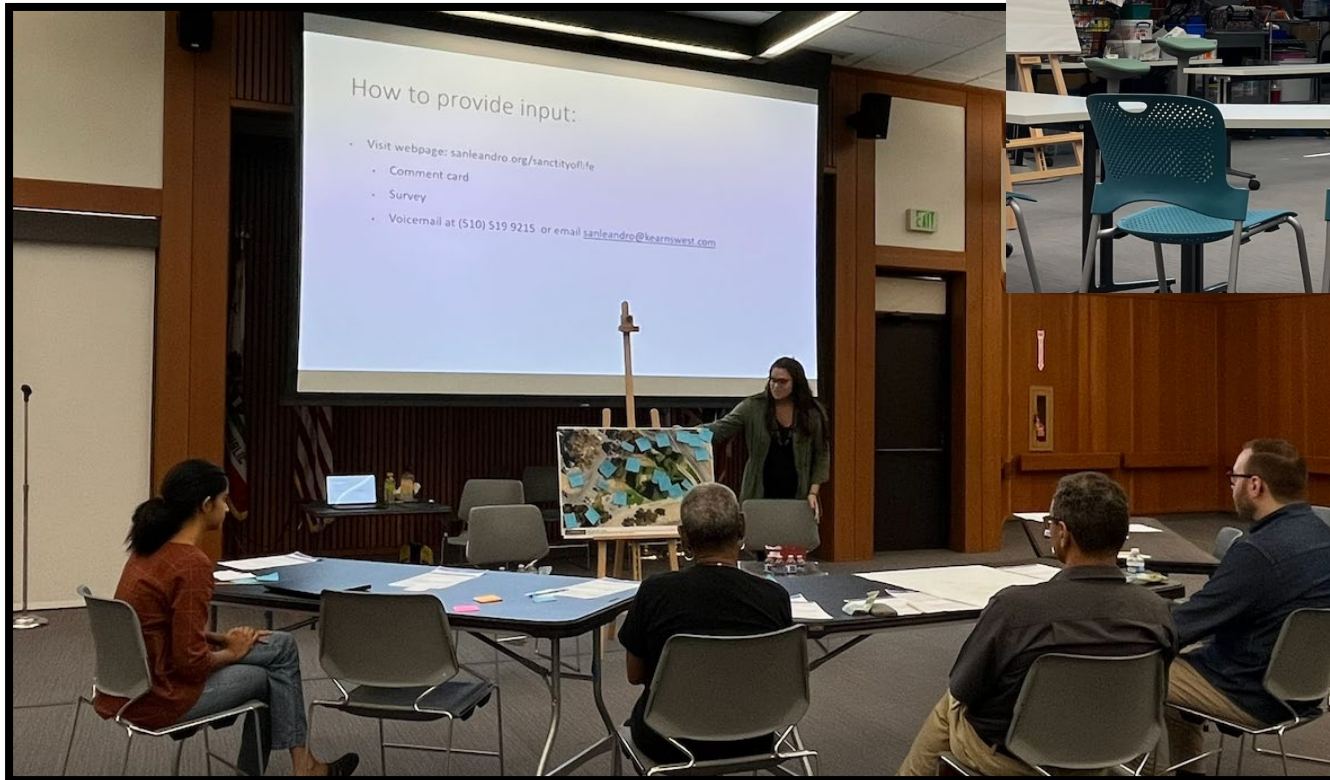

Ideas from the Public Gathered For Steven Taylor Memorial Design

The City of San Leandro is looking for the public's ideas on the design of the planned Marina Park memorial to Steven Taylor and others who have lost their lives due to police action.

The first in a series of public meetings to review designs was held Saturday, July 8 at the San Leandro

Main Library. There is also a link to the survey on the City of San Leandro's website at sanleandro.org/sanctityoflife.

Taylor was shot and killed by San Leandro police officer Jason Fletcher in 2020 after employees called police as Taylor was wielding a metal baseball bat at the Walmart on Hesperian Boulevard. Fletcher has since left the police department and was charged

with voluntary manslaughter, to which he plead not guilty, and is facing trial.

The City Council voted to set up the Steven Taylor Sanctity of Life Memorial following a public outcry after Taylor’s death. Calls for a memorial had come from, among others, Taylor’s grandmother Addie Kitchen and the Justice For Steven Taylor group, see *MEMORIAL*, page 5

many of whose members were students in the Social Justice Academy at San Leandro High School.

“I’d like to see healing for everybody. It’s for all impacted families, not just Steven Taylor,” said Kitchen about the memorial. “We’re not just picking on police.”

City staff had recommended moving the memorial from its originally planned site closer to the water to an area with trees a short distance away in Marina Park. The council agreed with the move earlier this year.

Sheila Marquises, city engineering and transportation director, said advantages of the site chosen included shade and some wind protection, a slight slope giving an amphitheater effect, and nearby exercise equipment that could be incorporated.

People at the meeting saw some examples of memorials elsewhere and made suggestions for elements to include in the Taylor memorial. Among the suggestions were seating of some sort, musical concerts and other arts events at the site, and perhaps an annual lantern festival where lanterns

float away on the water.

One person suggested planners take a look at the county’s Children’s Memorial on Fairmont Ridge off Fairmont Avenue above Interstate 580, which commemorates Alameda County children lost to gun and other violence.

Moderator Nahal Ipakshi, from the Kearns & West architectural firm hired by the city to plan the project, asked participants who else should be remembered at the site other than Taylor himself. Several people suggested honoring everyone who had lost their life to police action in the past in San Leandro, and those in nearby areas as well.

Kitchen cautioned about trying to memorialize every such person nationally.

“There are too many,” she said.

The design survey asks respondents to favor or oppose such commonly found elements of memorials as listing of names, symbolic or abstract art, photos of those being remembered, natural elements, information displays and audio or video.

The survey also asks for suggestions on incorporating the monarch butterfly theme that has been used recently on city projects. It notes butterflies symbolize transformation, hope, faith, and rebirth.

Another design meeting was scheduled to be held

Tuesday, July 11, at the library. Two more will be held in the Main Library’s Estudillo Room on Wednesday, Aug. 9, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m., and on Saturday, Aug. 12 from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.
