

## AA& NHPI Population Fastest Growing...


- Asian Americans fastest growing race/ethnicity group in Califiornia.
- Growth has been 25% over the last decade.
- According to the U.S.
   Census data, there was a
   49% increase in the Asian
   population in Alameda
   County and a 51%
   increase in the NHPI
   population between 2000
   and 2015 (not including
   AANHPI in combination)


#### Race and ethnicity breakdown of Bay Area counties in 2020

The largest racial group in San Leandro is Asian, with a population of 31,352 (34.39% of the total population)




## San Leandro Gap Study

- San Leandro AAPI population increased by 29%
  - Asians make up over 32% of the city's population
- High percentage of limited English proficiency (57%), especially among the elderly (79%)
- Currently, we serve:
  - The largest number of low income patients in San Leandro – about 40% of the low income patients


#### Racial / Ethnic makeup of San Leandro, CA

### **BEGINNING TO NOW**

- Founded in 1974 by students from Oakland Chinatown saw language barriers
- Rooted in social movement and advocacy: Civil Rights, Ethnic Studies, Health Care
- Federally qualified community health center with two pillars of **service** and **advocacy**
- Provides primary care, dental, behavioral health care to nearly 50,000 patients total
- Cultural competency: 14 Asian languages, bicultural staff from communities we serve:
  - Cantonese, Mandarin, Vietnamese, Korean, Cambodian, Mien, Hmong, Lao, Mongolian, Tagalog, Burmese, Karen, Karenni, and Thai











### Who We Serve in 2023








Age Breakdown

### Who We Serve in 2023


#### **Languages of Patients Served in 2023**






#### Mental Health Under-Utilization among Asian Americans

For Medi-Cal penetration rate (2015-16):

Alaska Native or American Indian	8.09%
Asian American	1.93%
Black or African American	8.40%
Hispanic or Latino American	5.06%
Pacific Islander	6.21%
White	6.73%



Responding to Mental Health Crisis & Workforce Shortage

- Since 2020, there was 2.5-fold increase in mental health needs. Our **AHS** comprehensive mental health services include
  - Integrated behavioral health (IBH) co-located in primary care and in dental services; mild to moderate
  - Specialty Mental Health (SMH) established in 2016; moderate to severe
  - Community Healing Initiative to support victims of violence
- Pipeline Development: Establishing Behavioral Health Training Academy
  - MSW/ MFT student interns to gain hands culturally & linguistically appropriate clinical experience at AHS





## **Health Through Community Healing**

Reduce the harm of anti-Asian hate and violence through community health initiatives

- Comprehensive Support Services for Survivors of Violence:
  - Trauma-informed mental health services
  - Wraparound care
- Health and healing through cultural practices:
  - Linguistically & culturally competent support groups
  - Yoga, Tai Chi, walking groups, cultural events
- Cross Racial Solidarity:
  - Black-Asian Racial Trauma Project with West Oakland Health



#### San Leandro Dental Clinic

Coming Soon in 2025



- CURRENT DENTAL NEEDS: Six-month waiting list for dental with up to eight months for specialty dental services
- CAPACITY: Up to 8,000 patients
- INTEGRATION: Dental-behavioral co-location with Counseling room

## Program of All-Inclusive Care for the Elderly (PACE)

- California's over-60 population is projected to grow faster than any other age group.
- By 2030, 10.8 million Californians will be an older adult, making up  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the state's population.

### 36% of AHS patients are over 65 yrs of age

- Enable those who are 55 and older to remain independent, even though they are certified to need nursing home care.
  - Coordinated medical care and support services
  - Keep aging adults safely in their own homes
- Program maintains a day health center that combines healthcare services, socialization, therapies, and meals.
