Secretary Liz Hodgins reported that board and commission applications remain open on a rolling basis and encouraged current high school students to reapply, especially in light of 16 graduating seniors this term. Members were reminded of the importance of sharing the opportunity broadly and referring interested students.

8.a. Report of the Chair

Chair Bammer reflected on her four years of service with YAC, beginning in 2021 when meetings were held virtually. She expressed pride in the projects and events accomplished during her tenure, including her favorite, Outdoor Movie Night, to multiple blanket-making events for community donation, and supporting local events such as MLK and Cinco de Mayo Celebrations as well as the Cherry Festival. She thanked members for their time and effort, and encouraged everyone to remain engaged in their communities.

8.b. Commissioner Reports

Commissioner Mohamad Abdellatif shared that a YouTube ad first inspired him to apply to YAC. He reflected on the honor of serving for three years and expressed how the experience strengthened his belief in the importance of youth voices. His time on YAC motivated him to study Politics and Government at UC Berkeley.

Commissioner Olivia Fernandez recalled being nervous when she first joined three years ago. Having been a longtime summer camp participant, volunteer, and now staff member, she appreciated the chance to stay engaged during the school year. She shared that she will pursue a minor in Political Science at

Loyola Marymount University.

Vice Chair Kayla Lam reflected on how her three years with YAC helped her gain confidence in public speaking. She shared that YAC gave her a space to express opinions thoughtfully and clearly, while also allowing her to connect with peers from different schools.

Commissioner Cassandra Bammer expressed gratitude and pride in supporting YAC's accomplishments, especially continuing the Outdoor Movie Night tradition. She shared that YAC created a space to come together, share ideas, and bring them to life. She also emphasized the value of diverse perspectives and collaborative problem-solving.
