A. Tennis Court/Pickleball Court Rehabilitation Survey Results

- Results of public survey/outreach were presented
- The survey received 492 responses
- The results favored a preference for the conversion of at least two tennis courts into pickleball courts at Heath Courts and Washington Manor Park.
- Parking enforcement should be reviewed at the two location, due to prevalence of non-recreation related parking.
- MSC (Shapiro/Schoenfeld) to approve that the Recreation and Parks Commission recommends that City Council considers the conversion of two tennis courts into pickleball courts at Heath Court and Washington Manor Park. (4 Ayes, 0 Nays, 1 Abstain)
