Community Engagement Data Review April 18, 2024



#### March 2<sup>nd</sup> Asian & Pacific Islander Listening Session

- Public safety is a major concern
  - More police officers & pedestrian safety improvements
- Social participation is important
  - Interested in more group activities around hobbies
  - Field trips to parks and beautiful outdoor areas
- Support and training for caregivers

#### March 9<sup>th</sup> Black & African American Listening Session

- Public safety is a major concern
  - More security guards & lighting in shopping areas
  - Address the homeless & mental health situation
  - More cameras at intersections to enforce unsafe driving
- Hire and recruit more Black medical personnel
- Increase income thresholds for affordable housing



#### March 16<sup>th</sup> Hispanic & Latino Listening Session

- More transportation/marketing of existing options
- Address homeless camps, especially near pedestrian areas
- Need for respite (out of home) and resources for caregivers
- Computer and technology classes for seniors
- Intergenerational volunteering opportunities
- Financial workshops and training for seniors/caregivers

#### March 19<sup>th</sup> & April 9<sup>th</sup> LGBTQ+ Listening Sessions

- More affordable housing specifically for LGBTQ+ seniors
- Access to culturally-competent caregivers
- Improved communication about existing resources (ex. create an LGBTQ+ resource guide)
- Improve access to healthcare and social services, especially mental health
- Opportunities for connecting and socialization there is lots of isolation and loneliness out there right now



#### March 23<sup>rd</sup> Persons with Disabilities Listening Session

- Enact policy reducing stigma/raising awareness of disability
- Clean and fix sidewalks and streets to increase mobility
- More ped accessibility infrastructure (flashing crosswalks, automatic doors)
- Accessible social opportunities to combat isolation and loneliness
- Make the bus safer to ride once onboard; covered seating while waiting
- Increase access to mental health care/services
- Increase access to assistive devices and mobility aids
- Affordable, accessible housing (ex. inclusionary zoning policy)

#### April 6<sup>th</sup> Native & Indigenous Listening Session

- Transportation for errands and to ceremonies/events
- In-person, in-home assistance and caregiving
- Affordable housing
- Food delivery and cooking/bringing hot, prepared meals
- Social engagement through home and phone visits
- Information about existing resources available to elders



#### April 9<sup>th</sup> General Population Listening Session

- Social activities that combat isolation and loneliness
- Traffic measures to increase pedestrian safety
- Effective security measures to address crime
- Better communication about existing resources/services
- Increase access to healthy, affordable food and basic needs
- Programs and training to help/support caregivers

#### April 11<sup>th</sup> Community Organization Listening Session

- Attendees affirmed the priorities we have heard from community members, with the following thoughts to add:
- Effect of lack of transportation on health (ex. missed appointments)
- Impact of "age-on-age" households (65+ caring for 90+)
- Think about undocumented seniors, as well as transportation and food access for homeless seniors
- Solutions need to be a part of community; leverage existing assets
- The need for services increased but COVID funding went away; how can we make this Plan sustainable? Private partners?

#### Similarities/Overlap between Listening Sessions

- Caregiving resources/access/respite
- Need to address pedestrian safety and fear of crime
- Better communication about existing resources
- Need to address social isolation and loneliness
- Need for affordable, accessible housing
- Need for affordable, reliable transportation



#### Differences/Nuances between Listening Sessions

- Need for accessibility (language and physical limitations)
- How to address social isolation and loneliness
- Need for food and basic needs programs for seniors
- Shifting what we mean by 'senior' from 50+ to 70+
- Interconnectivity of different areas of need

#### **Ranking Questions Explained**

- Ranking questions calculate the average ranking for each answer choice so we can determine which answer choice is most preferred overall.
- Weights are applied in reverse. In other words, the respondent's most preferred choice (which they rank as #1) has the largest weight, and their least preferred choice (which they rank in the last position) has a weight of 1.

#### Notable Differences Among Age Groups

- The general distribution of priorities holds across age groups, with the following nuances:
- As people grow older, their concern over Public Safety slightly increases, while their concern over Housing Security slightly decreases.
- Younger generations inflate the priority of Healthcare and underestimate the priority of Transportation & Mobility among seniors.
- Concern about Economic Participation spikes among people approaching retirement age, and decreases afterwards.

#### Notable Differences Among Racial & Ethnic Groups

- The general distribution of priorities also holds across racial and ethnic groups, with the following nuances:
- The Black community is much more concerned about Housing Security than Public Safety (and the inverse is true for Asian Americans).
- The API and Hispanic and Latino communities are more concerned about Healthcare and Wellness Services, which might indicate unique issues related to language accessibility.

#### On Average, Projects with <u>More Support</u> as People Age:

- Expand food and meals programs
- Expand aging-in-place models like the PACE Center
- Raise awareness of transportation resources/options
- More senior volunteer opportunities
- Seniors-only hours and/or parking at businesses



## On Average, Projects with Less Support as People Age:

- Enact housing protections like rent control
- Increase wheelchair accessibility everywhere
- More cultural and language-appropriate programs
- More youth volunteering to help seniors
- Repurpose underutilized buildings/space like malls
- More cultural and language-appropriate services/clinics
- More bike lanes and safer bike infrastructure



## Other Notable Differences Among Age Groups

- 65+ age group more interested in disability-accessible parking spaces, raising awareness of lifelong healthy aging/brain health, and having more technology education programs.
- Under 25 age group less interested in increasing pedestrian safety.
- Younger generations generally more interested in cleaner, more beautiful yards/spaces, and more employment resources for seniors.

## On Average, Projects with <u>More Support</u> among POC:

- Enact housing protections like rent control
- More employment resources for seniors
- Increase wheelchair accessibility everywhere
- More disability-accessible parking spaces
- More cultural/in-language programs, services and clinics, and more youth volunteering to help seniors (only API and Hispanic/Latino communities)



#### On Average, Projects with Less Support among POC:

- Expand aging-in-place models like the PACE Center
- Repurpose underutilized buildings/space like malls
- Remove barriers to building Accessory Dwelling Units
- More senior volunteer opportunities



#### Other Notable Differences Among Racial & Ethnic Groups

- API communities are generally more interested in cleaner, more beautiful yards/spaces.
- API communities are generally less interested in expanding companion traveling programs for errands.
- The African American community is generally more interested in intergenerational programs.
- Hispanic and Latino communities are generally less interested in more technology education programs (running counter to the listening session).
