

City Council Goals

2

- Place the City on a firm foundation for long-term fiscal sustainability
- ➤ Maintain and enhance the City's infrastructure
- Support and implement programs...that enhance the quality of life and wellness, celebrates the arts and diversity and promotes civic pride

Recent City Efforts To Address COVID-19



- ➤ Food Pantry Grants \$120,000
- ➤ Small Business Grants \$250,000
- ➤ Rental Assistance and Basic Needs \$79,000

CARES Act



- Public Law 116-136 signed March 27, 2020
- ➤ In response to the Coronavirus Pandemic (COVID-19)
- Allows for the reimbursement of costs incurred prior to the date of enactment (with limitations)
- ➤ Removes Public Services expenditure cap (normally 15% of grant award)
- > HUD-specific Guidance to expedite stimulus expenditures:
 - Amend 2019 Annual Action Plan to allocate CDBG-CV (stimulus funds)
 - Reduced public noticing/comment requirements to 5 days

COVID-19 Critical Needs in San Leandro

- Rental Housing Payment Relief & Assistance
- > Food Distribution
- Mental Health Services
- Domestic Violence Service

Eligibility Criteria for Proposed CDBG Funded Nonprofits

- Increased demand for food supply/distribution, mental health counseling, domestic violence service;
- ➤ Publicly vetted under the FY 2019-2021 Community Assistance Program (CAP) grant funding cycle;
- Capacity and experience to comply with federal CDBG administrative requirements.

Proposed Amendments 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan

Five Year Consolidated Plan Amendments:

- Certification of Urgent Need (National Objective): COVID-19;
- Identified Additional "Priority Need:"
 - COVID-19 Pandemic Response;
- ➤ Added Definitions to Community Development Needs Goals;
- > Statement of waiver received by City from HUD allowing reduced public notice/comment period from 30 to 5 days;
- ➤ Added "Disease Outbreaks" as a vulnerability to the City's lowand moderate-income households.

Proposed Amendments 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan

Annual Action Plan Amendments:

- Certification of Urgent Need (National Objective): COVID-19;
- Statement of waiver received by City from HUD allowing reduced public notice/ comment period from 30 to 5 days;
- Notification of where documents are posted given Shelter in Place orders (Library added new "Public Notices" portal);
- ➤ Added CDBG-CV (stimulus funding) as Anticipated Resource
- ➤ Added unspent prior year resources (ADA Transition Plan funding as of July 1, 2019 = \$508,840).

Proposed Amendments Citizen Participation Plan

Citizen Participation Plan Amendments:

- Allowed ability to hold "virtual" public hearings in response to national or local public health social distancing orders;
- Allowed reduced public notice/comment period in response to public health or other similar crisis to facilitate expedited allocation and expenditure of stimulus funding;
- ➤ Statement of waiver received by City from HUD allowing reduced public notice and public comment period from 30 to 5 days;
- Added Sections that identifies process for Emergency Response and Expedited Adoption of Substantial Amendments and, if needed, delayed Annual Reports;
- ➤ Added Section "Administrative Updates" that allows for changes to the Plan if those changes do not substantially change the scope and meaning of the document.

Proposed FY19-20 Annual Action Plan CDBG Funding Sources

- > Fy19-20 CDBG Grant Amount = \$707,517
- Prior year funding carryforward = \$364,991
- ➤ ADA Transition Plan unspent funds = \$508,840
- ➤ Program Income from FY 18-19 = \$ 35,424
- ➤ CDBG-CV HUD Stimulus Funding = \$451,972

 - > \$143,725 Building Futures for Women and Children
- ➤ General Administration (\$141,503) No Changes
 - > \$131,503 General Administration
 - > \$10,000 Fair Housing/ECHO Housing

 - > \$17,500 increased to \$42,500 Spectrum/SL Senior Lunch Program
 - > \$451,972 CDBG-CV Stimulus for Rental Assistance Program

 - > \$166,239 ADA Transition Plan Implementation Activities
- General Administration (\$153,662)
 - > \$143,662 General Administration
 - > \$10,000 Fair Housing/ECHO Housing

Proposed FY20-21 Annual Action Plan Amendments (for Council Review on June 15)

- ➤ Public Services (Increase from \$115,437 to \$465,437)

Proposed FY20-21 Annual Action Plan



<u>HOME Program</u> – No Changes

- > FY20-21 HOME Grant \$238,792
 - > Reflects 7.5% or \$16K increase from FY19-20
 - > \$13,664 for general administration

Staff Recommends the City Council:



- Hold a public hearing to approve the proposed amendments to FY 2015-2019 Consolidated Plan, FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan, and Citizen Participation Plan,
- Solicit public comment for a 5-day period (June 2 June 7, 2020), and
- Set a public hearing for June 15, 2020 to consider final approval of the Amendments to the FY 2015-2019 Five-Year Consolidated Plan, FY 2019-2020 Annual Action Plan, and Citizen Participation Plan
