**RESOLUTION NO. 2022-**

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF SAN LEANDRO CITY COUNCIL TO  
ACCEPT THE ANNUAL REPORT OF THE WEST SAN LEANDRO SHUTTLE  
BUSINESS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT (BID) FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023 AND TO  
DIRECT THE CITY MANAGER TO IMPOSE THE 2023 BID ASSESSMENT RATES  
INCREASED BY THE CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI)**

**WHEREAS**, by Ordinance No. 2014-023, adopted December 1, 2014, the City Council of the City of San Leandro established a Business Improvement Area known as the West San Leandro Shuttle Business Improvement District (the “BID”) to levy a benefit assessment on businesses within the BID, the proceeds of which shall be used for the public purposes therein described to benefit the businesses in the BID, pursuant to the Parking and Business Improvement Area Law of 1989 Section 36500 et seq. of Division 18 of the California Streets and Highways Code (the “Act”); and

**WHEREAS**, as required by the Act, the City Council established an Advisory Board to prepare and submit an annual report on assessments levied and collected to pay the costs of the improvements and activities of the BID; and

**WHEREAS**, the Advisory Board has met and reviewed the activities of the BID and the proposed assessment for the 2023-2024 fiscal year; and

**WHEREAS**, the Advisory Board has caused the preparation of the Annual Report of the West San Leandro Shuttle Business Improvement District Fiscal Year 2022-2023, a copy of which is attached, and hereby presents same to this Council; and

**WHEREAS**, the Council is familiar with the contents thereof; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Manager recommends acceptance of said Annual Report which includes a recommendation to increase the BID fee rate equal to the increase in the Consumer Price Index (CPI), which is 6.8 percent.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of San Leandro does **RESOLVE** as follows:

That said Annual Report is hereby accepted and the City Manager is hereby directed to impose the BID Assessment with an increase to the BID per owner/employee assessment rate by the CPI factor of 6.8 percent to \$27.63 per owner/employee for businesses in the BID Area. Businesses with three or fewer owner/employees, landlords, and non-profits will continue to be exempt from the BID assessment, as recommended by the Advisory Board.
