Restorative Pathways is an innovative nonprofit committed to ending domestic violence, human trafficking, and violent crime through hope, advocacy, and connection.





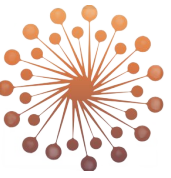
What We Do

Restorative Pathways serves people who have experienced domestic violence, human trafficking, and/or a violent crime. We also serve individuals who have caused harm.

We provide emergency shelter, transitional housing, rental subsidies, mental health, and supportive services. All of our services are trauma-sensitive, practice the relational model, and are client-centered.

We serve clients throughout the greater bay area and surrounding counties. All of our services are provided at no cost to clients, and there are low barriers to participation.

Residential Shelters



Restorative Pathways provides clients with access to our residential programs, transitional housing, and supportive services. There is no maximum length of stay at our shelters; all facilities focus on harm reduction and have minimal rules. All supportive services are optional for the clients. No fees are taken from the clients for their stay.

We currently have seven (10) facilities:

- **Betty's Village:** *For female-identifying individuals or single parents and their children*
- **Casa de Ruby:** *For male-identifying individuals*
- **House of Acceptance (HOA):** *For special populations*
- **Her House:** *For self-identified females aged 18-24*
- **HIS House:** *For individuals who have caused harm*
- **Winter Shelter at Solara House:** *Winter Respite for Transitional Aged Youth*
- **Safe Stay Program:** *Hotel Services for singles and families*
- **Youth Village:** *For unaccompanied minors aged 12-17*
- **Lena's House:** *For foster Youth 13-17*
- **Phoenix Rising Youth House:** *For unaccompa*



Housing

Our Housing program is tailored to help survivors of domestic violence or human trafficking with rental subsidies, deposits and/or moving expenses. The goal of the housing program is to ensure a survivor a safe place for their families and an opportunity to reach self-sufficiency.

Subsidies typically start at 100% of the rent and scale down over time based on multiple factors, including the client's income.

Case management and other supportive services are provided.





Youth Services

Restorative Pathways operates 4 dedicated youth facilities and a winter respite shelter.

These facilities provide safe, nurturing environments with tailored resources for each age group, supporting their unique needs as they transition toward independence.

In addition to our youth and TAY facilities; Restorative Pathways has a specific Youth Outreach Team to provide services to youth. These specialized case management services are for individuals aged 12 to 24.





Clinical

Our multicultural, multi-disciplinary team of dedicated professionals provides personalized and evidence-based mental health care through both telehealth and in-person sessions, supporting clients impacted by the after-effects of emotional trauma. With training in a variety of therapeutic modalities, our clinical staff delivers trauma sensitive, one-on-one interventions that focus on the whole person.

Restorative Pathways offers mental health services to those of all ages.



RAFT

R.A.F.T. (*Restorative Action For Family Transformation*) aims to facilitate healing, accountability, and transformation for individuals who have caused harm within their families or communities. We recognize that behind every harmful action lies a complex set of circumstances and emotions that must be addressed in order for true healing to occur. The focus is on the following areas:

- **Case Management:** Developing individualized plans for client goals and self-sufficiency, assisting with resources for federal/state support and legal aid.
- **Shelter & Housing:** Assist clients with accessing safe shelter and housing (including rental subsidies where qualified)
- **Facilitated Peer Groups:** Facilitated peer groups serves as a preventative effort to harm reduction and assists with reducing recidivism
- **Clinical Services:** Assist clients with restorative/transformational justice processes clinicians work with clients who have been incarcerated or have had other legal consequences, as well as the challenges that come along with reentry and reunification



Learning & Development

Restorative Pathways provides essential training for individuals and teams wanting to expand their knowledge of human trafficking, domestic violence, and violent crime through our trauma-informed, relational lens.

We offer the following:

- 60hr Domestic Violence & Human Trafficking Peer Counseling Training
- 40hr Human Trafficking Peer Counseling Training
- Group Training Sessions
- Youth Training Sessions
