URGENCY ORDINANCE ZONING MORATORIUM – NEW TOBACCO SALES City Council 06.03.24

Background

- Staff proposing temporary moratorium for <u>new</u> businesses selling tobacco and e-cigarette related items to address outdated Zoning regulations that limit enforcement options
- Municipal Code Chapter 4-36 Tobacco Retailers Ordinance prohibits sale of e-cigarettes, tobacco, and related products without valid Tobacco Retailers License (TRL)

- Zoning Code Chapter 1.12 defines "tobacconist/cigarette store" as business devoted primarily to the sale of tobacco, e-cigarettes, and/or related products:
 - O > 20% floor/display area or

 - Only allowed in certain zones with Conditional Use Permit
 - O 1,500' separation requirement from sensitive uses school, park, library
 - O Restrictions on hours 6am 10pm

Background

- Zoning "loophole" allows businesses under permitting thresholds to obtain TRL and sell tobacco-related products without protections
- Since 2021, staff has observed increase in new "Smoke Shops" locating in San Leandro utilizing Zoning loophole
- Current Zoning regulations limit enforcement options



Proposed Urgency Ordinance

- Establish a temporary moratorium:
 - Prohibit <u>new</u> Tobacconist/Cigarette Stores
 Existing legal tobacconist/cigarette stores would not be impacted and could continue to operate
 - Prohibit sale of tobacco-related products or electronic-cigarette related products in <u>new locations</u> (as of 6/3/24) except new Supermarkets over 20,000 sq ft
 - Would not prevent new businesses from being established in a location where such products are currently sold unless they qualify as Tobacconist/Cigarette Stores under the Zoning Code

Outreach and Next Steps

- Notice mailed to existing businesses with TRL
- ▷ If Council adopts moratorium, staff will:
 - O Review codes to evaluate appropriate regulations
 - O Initiate enforcement of non-compliant businesses
 - O Return to Council within 45-days to evaluate need for extension
 - O Return to Council with recommended Code amendments

Return to Council to Consider Extension

Financial Impacts

- No direct fiscal impact with adoption of moratorium.
- Staff time related to reviewing current Municipal Code and Zoning Code for potential revisions



Recommendation

- Staff recommends Council adopt urgency ordinance enacting a zoning moratorium to prohibit:
 - O Sale of tobacco-related products and electronic cigarette-related products in new locations
 - O New tobacconist/cigarette stores
