Background Info

What is the Age-Friendly Action Plan?

A five-year roadmap outlining the work still to be done to make our city a more livable and happier place for its older adults (and by extension, residents of all ages)

Why an Age-Friendly Action Plan?

- 1. To be prepared for dramatic growth in older adult population (e.g., baby boomers, with advances in medical technology, public health, and living standards)
- 2. To combat the bias of ageism and reduce isolation and loneliness from the COVID pandemic
- 3. To secure additional funding through focused, intentional senior services planning

Alignment with Key Partners

- 1. Fulfills requirements of membership in AARP's Network of Age-Friendly States and Communities
- 2. Aligns with age-friendly projects/activities in County adult and aging plans, City strategic plans, and missions of other City Commissions
- 3. Aligns with goals of local age-friendly community partners





- Need for affordable, reliable transportation








Community Survey


- 701 responses from San Leandro residents

Staff Recommendations

Priority Areas & Projects

- 1. Plan Sustainability
 - 1. Operationalize the Age-Friendly San Leandro initiative
 - 2. Improve communications and outreach about existing resources
 - 3. Ensure language accessibility across all communications and services
- 2. Personal Protection
 - 4. Install pedestrian safety measures
 - 5. Clean and beautify high-traffic pedestrian areas
 - 6. Help protect residents from cyber attacks and fraudulent activity

Priority Areas & Projects (continued)

- 3. Housing Security
 - 7. Identify short-term projects that complement existing local affordable housing efforts
- 4. Health & Wellness
 - 8. Expand existing food, meal and basic needs programs
 - 9. Provide respite and resources for family and volunteer caregivers

Priority Areas & Projects (continued)

- 5. Transportation
 - 10. Expand accessible transportation options for seniors and persons with disabilities
 - 11. Improve ADA accessibility of infrastructure, facilities, and services
- 6. Social Connection
 - 12. Provide day trips to local parks and outdoor areas
