

- \$5 Million of Developer ImpactFee funds included



# Bicycle Network (West)




#### Bicycle Network (West)

- Closes a major gap in the SF Bay Trail













# Shoreline Development



- Plan includes hotel, conference center, restaurants, residential units, public promenade and other amenities
- Draft EIR to be released
   December 2014
- \$300M investment

# Kaiser North Parcel Development

- 26.5-acre opportunity site
- Entitled for retail, including 200-room hotel
- Development to provide needed restaurants and business services to the industrial area

## Davis St Integrated Waste Processing Facility

- Three-phase development to increase mixed material processing and achieve a 50% waste reduction rate.
- Includes indoor composting facility, sort line improvements, CNG station and a new mixed materials processing line.
- \$100M investment to be completed by July 2018



#### San Leandro Creek Trail Master Plan



- Awarded \$201k grant to prepare a master plan for the San Leandro Creek Trail
- Partnership between Cities of San Leandro and Oakland, Friends of San Leandro Creek, Rails to Trails Conservancy and National Park Service
