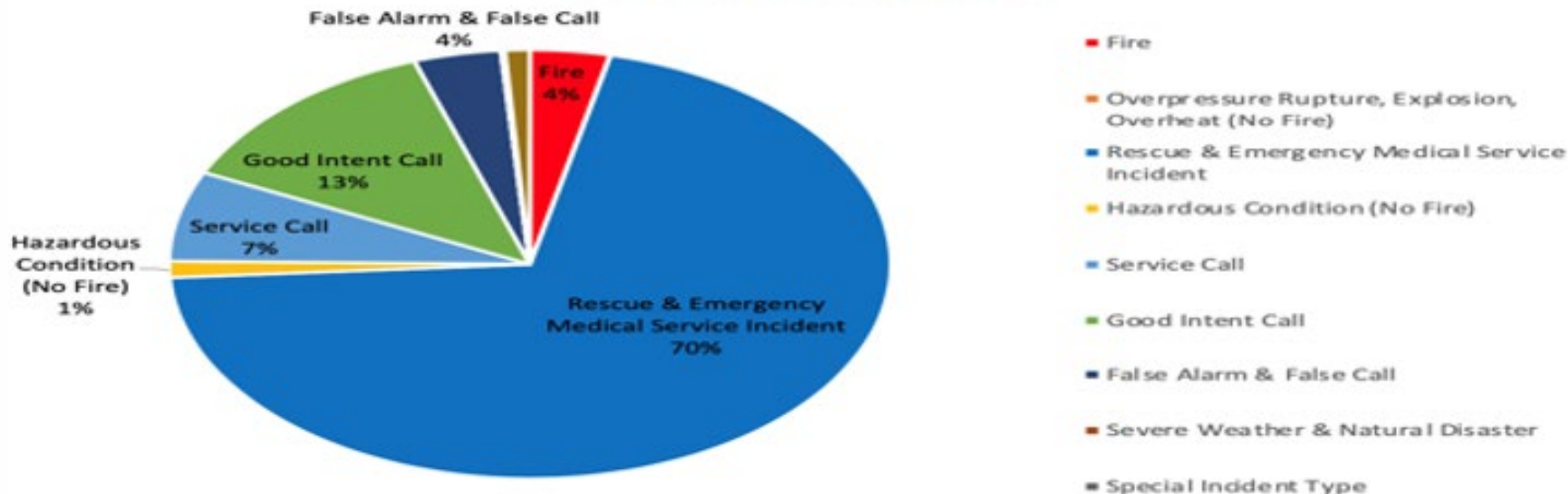

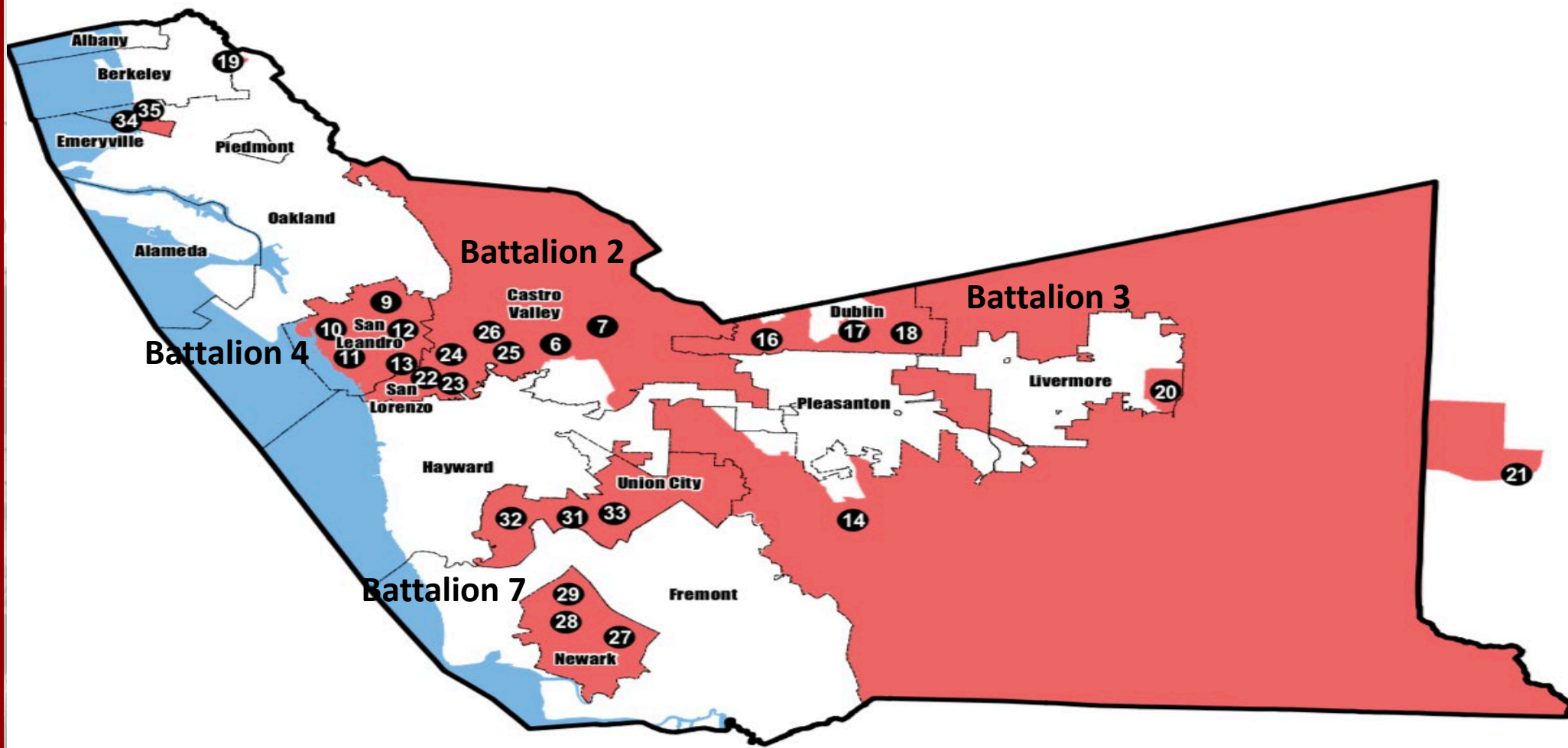
Alameda County Fire
