RECAP OF JUNE RULES COMMITTEE FEEDBACK

- Is there interest in eliminating the requirement for a CUP?

OTHER FOLLOW-UP FROM JUNE MEETING

Lounges:

Oakland and Berkeley are the only cities in Alameda County to allow on-site consumption.

Tax Apportionment:

The California Department of Tax and Fee Administration provides the "point of sale" for delivery of cannabis is the address of the delivery.


City of Los Angeles adopted a local ordinance requiring cannabis deliveries from outside city limits to:

- register with the Police Department,
- show proof of license, and
- payment of the city's business license tax.

Enforcement is extremely challenging:

- Requires close coordination with District Attorney's office, SLPD, Finance Dept, and likely outside consultants to investigate and enforce (in addition to BCC and CDTFA).
- Limitations in accessing records from businesses outside of City jurisdiction.

Commercial Zones


CC - Commercial Community

STAFF RECOMMENDATION (CONT'D)

- Align zoning code with Municipal Code to allow cannabis dispensaries as a conditionally permitted use in all commercial and industrial zones, subject to 600-foot setbacks
- Codify clearer definition of Youth Center, using City of Alameda definition:

"Youth centers" means any public or private facility that is exclusively used to host recreational or social activities for minors (under eighteen (18) years of age), such as, private youth membership organizations or clubs, social service teenage club facilities, or amusement facilities. "Youth centers" does not include any building, location, or facility where any programs, activities, or services: (a) are offered at private residences, (b) involve martial arts/combat sports, cultural or similar education, or physical fitness, or (c) are offered for fewer than five hours per day each day the building, location, or facility is open. Notwithstanding the foregoing, youth centers shall also mean any facility determined by the Recreation and Parks Department to be a recreation center in a city park."
