ARPA FUNDING OVERVIEW

American Rescue Plan Act of 2021

- American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Signed Into Law March 11, 2021
 - \$1.9 Trillion Total
 - \$350B to states and local governments
 - \$65B to counties
 - \$65B to cities



Local Fiscal Recovery Funds

- Payments to Local Governments
 - First tranche 60 days after enactment
 - Second tranche 12 mo. after first tranche
- □ San Leandro Allocation \$18.6M
 - \$9.3M received in May 2021
- □ U.S. Treasury Guidelines
 - Issued in May 2021
 - More updates are expected



THE AMERICAN RESCUE
PLAN ACT OF 2021

Eligible Uses of ARPA Funding

- □ COVID-19 Eligible Expenditures
 - Services to contain and mitigateCOVID-19
 - Behavioral healthcare services including mental health, substance abuse treatments, and services to promote access to social services

- Negative Economic Impact
 - Assistance to households
 - Support for small businesses and nonprofits
 - Support to impacted industries such as tourism, travel, and hospitality sectors

Eligible Uses of ARPA Funding

- Premium Pay for Eligible Workers
 - Can be used retroactively
 - Offering additional support to those who will bear the greatest health risks (workers at food production facilities, grocery stores, janitors/sanitation workers, warehouse workers, truck drivers, etc.)
- For Government Services to the Extent of the Loss of Revenues
 - Government services directly
 provide services or aid to citizens
 - Infrastructure including maintenance
 - Fire, police, or public safety

Eligible Uses of ARPA Funding

- Investments in Water, Sewer, and Broadband
 Infrastructure
 - Make necessary improvements to improve access to clean drinking water and support vital wastewater and stormwater infrastructure (e.g., building/upgrading facilities and transmission systems)
 - Build broadband infrastructure with modern technology providing reliable download and upload speeds
 - Assist household to support internet access or digital literacy



Ineligible Uses and Timeframe

- □ Ineligible Uses
 - Fund pension deposits
 - Replenish reserves/rainy day funds
 - Pay for debt service payments, legal settlements, or judgements
 - Offset reductions in taxes
- Eligible Costs Timeframe
 - Covered period is March 3, 2021-December 31, 2024
 - Costs can be incurred by December 31, 2024, or December 31, 2026 if funds are obligated by December 31, 2024
- □ Interim Report August 31, 2021
- □ Project & Expenditure Report October 31, 2021
 - Then 30 days after end of each quarter thereafter


PROPOSED USES OF ARPA FUNDS

Key Principles for Utilizing Funds

- Recover lost revenues first
- Maximize investments for the community
- Assess City operations and community needs
- Meets City Council priorities
- Partner with nonprofits and other organizations
- Use one-time funding for one-time expenditures
- Use restricted resources first



Replacing Revenues for Gov't Services



- Key programs funded in 21-22 Budget:
- □ Infrastructure maintenance
- ☐ Human services

- Library services
- Recycling program
- Park and street maintenance

Facilities & Infrastructure:

- Recovery Plan & Administration Assist HdL
- Technology Upgrades & Digital Divide
- Emergency Preparation & Response management systems, training, vaccination, testing, and PPE
- HVAC & Filtration Upgrades Library, Senior Center, City Hall, etc.
- Cleanliness Clean Streets Team



Human Services:

- Food insecurity support
- Domestic violence programs
- Mental health & homelessness services
- Short-term & Long-Term homeless navigation center
- RV safe zone parking solution to address homelessness



Community Development:


- Commercial relief grants
- Small Business Assistance (website assistance, restaurant revitalization)
- Work force development / retraining (outsourced to consultant)
- Shop Local / Reopening Marketing
- Additional housing counseling / fair housing support





Engineering & Transportation:

- Broadband infrastructure enhancements
- Trash capture storm water phase III (if earmark is unsuccessful)
- North area storm drainage improvements
