ANIMAL CONTROL

BACKGROUND

- The Police Department has relied on the SPCA for animal sheltering services since 2021, after the City of Fremont could no longer accommodate our volume.



More Than a Shelter

- On July 21, 2025, the Council approved a six-month extension of the East Bay SPCA agreement while staff evaluated alternative service providers.
- A multi-county survey, which began in March 2025, found that, due to capacity limitations across Alameda and Contra Costa Counties, the East Bay SPCA was the only provider able to continue animal sheltering services.
- On July 14, 2025, Chief Averiett briefed the Council on the cost of a six-month SPCA contract and noted that a new long-term agreement would be presented for approval.

ANALYSIS



- Research completed in September 2025 showed that using alternatives to the East Bay SPCA would increase costs and reduce efficiency by requiring multiple service providers.
- By September 2025, all viable alternative options had been thoroughly evaluated and exhausted.



- City municipal code requires the SPCA to impound animals found loose or tethered in public areas and allows residents to drop off stray animals at no cost (SLMC 4-11-400; 4-11-405).
- These requirements increase City costs for stray intake and boarding, prompting staff to prioritize responses to vicious or injured animals and to temporarily hold strays to support reunification before SPCA transfer.

STATISTICS- CUSTODY, BITES, AND INJURED

- Most dogs were found roaming in San Leandro, either as strays or after escaping from their homes.
- Cats brought in typically had minor injuries, were young kittens displaced or separated from their mothers.
- This reflects activity before recent procedural changes; staff now respond only to cats that are severely sick or injured.
