4. CITY STAFF REPORTS AND ANNOUNCEMENTS

4.A. City-Wide Updates

Regarding the vacant Senior Commission seat for District 5, the City Clerk's Office has not received any applications. Staff will continue to promote the vacancy by including it in the Senior Services monthly calendar and through social media.

4.B. Human Services Department-Wide Updates

The biannual homeless Point-in-Time (PIT) count will take place on Thursday, January 22, 2026, from 5:00am – 9:30am. Fifty-four volunteers are needed to effectively conduct the count. To date, 47 volunteers have been secured.

The Human Services Department executed a contract with Bay Area Community Services (BACS), a local non-profit, to help prevent homelessness among extremely low-income households, offering modest ongoing rental assistance to stabilize housing for individuals and families at risk of eviction. Outreach will commence soon with the goal of launching the program by April 1, 2026. This is an 18-month program funded through the CA Department of Housing and Community Development (HCD) and will provide rental assistance and support services to at least 70 households.

4.C. Senior Services Updates

Liliana Gray provided an update regarding senior services offered since the last Senior Commission meeting in November 2025. She highlighted the Annual Thanksgiving Luncheon attended by over 180 people. Once again, the event was conducted in collaboration with Spectrum Community Services. On December 4th, the second Annual Senior Services Expo was held to promote the senior services offered at the Senior and Marina Community Centers. Over 100 people attended the event sponsored by Kaiser Permanente. Lastly, there was a Holiday Bingo event attended by about 100 people. Mrs. Gray ended with updates about upcoming programs, events, and community outreach.

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS

One member of the public introduced themselves and shared comments. No Public Comments were received via eComment; the Commission was advised by email on Wednesday, January 14, 2026.

6. PRESENTATIONS

6.A. FLEX RIDES Program Assessment Update Presentation

Mike King and Human Services Department staff shared an update about the FLEX RIDES Assessment. The presentation included purpose and goals of the assessment, assessment methodology, assessment findings, preliminary recommendations, and an update regarding next steps. Bicycle and Pedestrian Advisory Commission (BPAC)

- Advocate walking and biking in San Leandro
- Advise and review plans related to transportation and traffic safety
- Support City Plans such as:
 - Local Roadway Safety Plan (LRSP)
 - Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan



Neighborhood Traffic Calming Program (NTCP)

- Traffic Calming examples: speed humps, bulb outs, speed feedback signs
- Goal to reduce vehicle speeds and cut-through traffic
- Based on type of roadway, vehicle speeds, traffic volume
- Petition Process



Crosswalk Prioritization Program

- New crosswalks
- Criteria based on number of lanes, traffic volumes, vehicles speed, pedestrian volume, and other factors
 - Ages & abilities
 - Schools
 - Connections to destinations
- Supplemented by signage and striping, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon (RRFB), Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB)



Stop Signs

- Require warrant based on the California MUTCD
- For assigning right-of-way and NOT addressing speeding
- Based on Crash Experience, Sight Distance, Traffic Volume




Street Lighting

- Typically installed at every intersection & on every other pole within the mid-block
- Spacing between lights of approximately 300’.

Exceptions:

- 1. Alignment of street is such that additional light is required to properly light the street*
- 2. Light at an intersection & light at first pole adjacent to intersection*
- 3. If large trees obscure lighting*



Sidewalk Repair Program

- **Property owners are responsible for the maintenance of the sidewalk along their property frontage**
 - San Leandro Municipal Code Sections 5-1-415 & 5-1-420
 - San Leandro Administrative Code Sections 8.1.110 through 8-1-125
 - California Streets and Highways Code Section 5600 through 5630



Sidewalk Repair Program

- **If your sidewalk needs repair, as a property owner, you have these available options:**
 - Repair the sidewalk yourself, hire properly licensed contractor and obtain City Encroachment Permit.
 - Join the City's Annual Sidewalk Repair Program
 - Request grinding and/or patching by the City's Public Works Department



Sidewalk Repair Program

- **When does the City share in the cost of a sidewalk repair?**
 - If a City street tree is the cause of the damage and if the property owner joins the Sidewalk Repair Program, the repair cost is divided evenly between the property owner and the City.
- **What do I do when I see sidewalks that are in disrepair?**
 - To report a hazardous sidewalk location or to have a City inspector inspect and provide a cost estimate on necessary repairs, please call 510-577-3305 or report your concern through:

DAMAGE TO THE PARKWAY STRIP

The area between the sidewalk and curb (commonly called the parkway strip) is frequently filled with concrete, bricks or other surface improvements. **The City does not require removal or repair of these improvements except where damage:**


- 1) prevents or interferes with sidewalk repair.
- 2) is in an area of high pedestrian use (such as at a crosswalk), and is therefore treated like a sidewalk.
- 3) includes defects that may cause a risk of injury to the public.

If adjacent sidewalk repairs are made, the property owner is advised to consider making any adjustments to the parkway strip that may be needed to create conformity with the new sidewalk. These and any other costs related to improvements within the parkway strip belong exclusively to the property owner.





 - **Staff reviewing feasibility of a City-wide Revenue Bond Measure**



Program Overview: Current Services

FLEX RIDES Shuttle Service

- Four fixed route shuttles that make bi-directional hourly loops around San Leandro
- Unlimited free rides
- Mondays, Tuesdays and Thursdays 8:30 am - 5:30 pm



FLEX RIDES On-Demand

- Personalized dispatch of Uber rides making it a fast and convenient travel option
- **Subsidized On Demand service**
 - Cost is \$4/ride. FLEX covers remaining ride costs up to a maximum of \$20
 - Cost over \$20 is paid by member
- **Service Hours** 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year
- **Service Area**
 - Alameda, Ashland, Castro Valley, Cherryland, Dublin, Emeryville, Fremont, Hayward, Livermore, Newark, Oakland, Pleasanton, San Leandro, San Lorenzo, San Ramon, Union City
- **Out-of-area medical appointments**

Program Eligibility

FLEX Shuttle:

- San Leandro Resident
- 50+ or 18 years old plus East Bay Paratransit Certified

FLEX RIDES On-Demand:

- Enrolled in FLEX Program
- 70+ or 18 years old plus East Bay Paratransit Certified

Program Overview: Current Services



Day Trip Program

Provides older adults 50+ day trips to local parks, outdoor areas, shows, and community events.

Senior Emergency Evacuation Program

Seniors and people with disabilities receive evacuation support during an emergency when the City of San Leandro activates a support shelter/center.

Senior Grocery Delivery Program

Residents of the San Leandro age 50+ who are homebound due to health conditions, or mobility limitations will get grocery bags delivered to their homes twice a month by VACCEB staff.



Door-to-Door/Volunteer Driver Program

Free, compassionate door-to-door transportation services, provided by volunteers, for older adults and individuals with disabilities to locations where they can be connected to services, agencies, and medical appointments

- Monthly sessions at Senior Community Center and Marina Community Center

Program Updates: Assessment Results



Areas for improvement:

1. Current route loops are too long and the schedule too tight for drivers
2. Many eligible riders are not familiar with the service or are confused by the schedule/location of stops
3. Certain stops are not being utilized
4. Seating and shelter at stops needed to make service more accessible



Short-Term Improvements

1. Develop and document a new realistic schedule that takes into account minimum dwell time at all stops, driver breaks, traffic and other time-of-day variations.
2. Update the published schedule, displaying the actual, realistic pickup and drop-off times at each stop
3. Publish and actively promote the updated schedule to FLEX RIDES members and the broader public
4. Create and install new signage inside each bus
5. Recommend durable, low-maintenance, and cost-effective seating and canopy solutions for FLEX RIDES stops.
6. Improve ridership data by requiring drivers to enter real-time data into TripShot.
7. Explore piloting a twice monthly orientation ride-along that new riders can join to learn how to use the service
