- Audio/video recording






Considerations

 - Minimize harm




Early Adopter

New Legislation

- AB 1740
 - Recycler required to record the year, make, model,
 - and a copy of the vehicle title.
 Prohibited from purchasing a catalytic converter from a person who is not the verifiable owner.
- **SB 1087**
 - Prohibits the purchase of a used catalytic converter other than from specified sellers and an individual with proof of ownership
 Recyclers can only buy from specified sellers



Potential Solutions

- Partner with local businesses to offer free or discounted catalytic converter etching/encasing
- Enact a local ordinance to discourage theft/resale
 Unlawful to possess without proof
- Widely publicize our layered approach through varied media platforms, pamphlets, newsletters, etc.



Recommendation

- Staff recommends we not execute a bait car program but implement multi-pronged deterrents:
 - Work with local businesses to explore free/discounted catalytic converter etching/encasing
 - Adopt a local ordinance making it illegal to possess/sell/purchase a used catalytic converter
 - Employ a broad awareness/education campaign
