

ORGANIZATIONAL OVERVIEW



SNAPSHOT OF LA CLÍNICA

- Founded in 1971 by UC Berkeley students & community activists
- Headquartered in Oakland's Fruitvale District
- Federally Qualified Health Center (FQHC)
- Received first HRSA 330 Program grant in early 70's
- Governed by an 18-member Consumer-Majority Board of Directors

RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS: CARE OF SPECIAL POPULATIONS

- Increased # of HIV patients served (>120)
- Increased prescription of PrEP for HIV prevention to high risk patients (>70)
- Increased # of transgender patients served in TRIUMPH clinic (>50)
- Expanded capacity for placement of Long-Acting Reversible Contraceptives (LARC) at SBHC sites
- Expanded Medication Assisted Treatment of Opioid Use
 Disorder (>70 patients)
- Expanded treatment for Hepatitis C (>120 patients)



RECENT ACCOMPLISHMENTS: SOCIAL DETERMINANTS OF HEALTH

- Expanded work to support food security
 - Food as Medicine prescriptions
 - Food pantries
 - Pop-up food "farmacies"
- Piloted NextGen Template for collecting social determinants of health data via the PRAPARE tool (Protocol for Responding to and Assessing Patients' Assets, Risks, and Experiences)



DEVELOPING WORKFORCE PIPELINES

- Expanding workforce training programs and career ladders for Medical Assistants, Dental Assistants, and Clinical Office Assistants
- Expanded volunteer program: over 100 at more than 13 sites
- Expanded AmeriCorps Health Education program: 8 members at 8
 SBHC clinic sites
- Continue to strengthen academic partnerships and training programs
 - Medical, dental, psychiatric residencies
 - MA/DA training programs
 - Primary Care Leadership Program


- 86,884 patients served

- o 874 FTE employees








La Clínica has provided health services to San Leandro residents since opening its first community health center in East Oakland in 1971

- ☐ San Antonio Neighborhood Health Center: 1030 International Blvd., Oakland, CA
 - WIC program
 - 19 exam rooms; offers medical, integrated behavioral health, clinical health education, enabling services, specialty services, laboratory, and pharmacy
- ☐ Family Optical: 3060 B. E 9th Street, Oakland, CA
 - 4 exam rooms; offers optometry & ophthalmology services
- ☐ Clínica Alta Vista: 1515 Fruitvale Ave, Oakland, CA
 - Provides adolescent health services
- ☐ Fruitvale Transit Village: 3451 E 12th Street, Oakland, CA
 - 51 exam rooms & 10 dental operatories
 - Offers medical, dental, integrated behavioral health, clinical health education, enabling services, specialty services, pharmacy, laboratory, and radiology services





SUPPORTING YOUTH & YOUNG ADULTS AT FUENTE WELLNESS CENTER

- □ 2010: La Clínica chosen by ACHCSA as lead health operator at REACH Ashland Youth Center
 - Location: 16335 East 14th Street, San Leandro, CA 94578
 - Designed to support:
 - o Homeless youth
 - Youth transitioning out of juvenile justice or foster care systems
- □ 2013: La Clínica opens Fuente Wellness Center within REACH
 - Serves youth and young adults ages 11-24
 - School linked health center serving:
 - Arroyo & San Lorenzo High Schools
 - Bohannon, Edendale, & Washington Middle Schools
