

## **KEY BUSINESS TERMS**



#### Term and Services:

- 10 year base term with extension options
- City ability to mix-and-match services from different proposers

## Compensation:

- Annual index rate adjustments
- Recyclables rate adjustment to reflect quality and value of processed material
- Revenue from sale of recyclables shared with ratepayers
- Caps on annual adjustments

#### Indemnification and Insurance:

- CERCLA indemnification for the City
- Required Pollution Liability Insurance



## TOTAL RATE IMPACT



- The enhanced and new service contracts are estimated to increase rates approximately 2% to 5% due to due to:
  - New state-wide electric vehicle fleet regulations.
  - Regulatory and market changes that increase processing and disposal costs.
  - Enhancements to existing services.
  - New services provided to residents and businesses
- Final rate impact to be determined based on finalized negotiation of rates for new and enhanced services.
