Overview

Staff recommends that the City Council Approve Appropriation of \$400,000 from General Fund Reserves for Additional Business Grants to Address Urgent Business Needs During the COVID-19 Pandemic



Background

- 12/14/20 City Council Directed Staff to:
- Allocate \$150,000 in budgeted business incentive funds towards the Alameda County CARES Small Business Grant program
- □ Evaluate the amount of City reserve funds to provide grants to additional businesses in need.
- Evaluate whether there are additional unmet community needs that were not otherwise addressed by the City and may need immediate assistance from reserve funds.

Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

Community:

- Increased Unemployment
- Increased Food Insecurity
- Inability to Pay Rent & Risk of Homelessness
- Loss of childcare/ in person school resources
- Increased stress and mental health challenges
- Unmet health needs



Impact of COVID-19 Pandemic

- Businesses experiencing significant negative impacts
 - Required closures (some for 8 months)
 - Costly safety precautions & adaptations
 - Changes in consumer behaviors
- Service, food, specialty retail, fitness, and hospitality/event businesses particularly impacted
- Significant operational and financial challenges









Community Assistance

Homelessness Emergency Aid Program - \$372,000

- Portable showers, case management, hotel vouchers, rental assistance, & free groceries
- Domestic Violence Assistance \$105,000
 - Rental assistance, resource referral (211), emergency shelter & food program
- SL Community Assistance Program \$150,000
 - Food access, counseling, legal aid, family support services, health services for youth, food access for seniors, and shelter services
- Mental Health, Domestic Violence and Food Distribution - \$490,000 (federal CDBG)



Community Assistance

- Food Assistance Programs doubled the amount of food provided; grants for pantries & food providers
- **Free COVID-19 Testing -** In partnership with State, County and Eden Health District
- **Language Warm Line** assisted in creation of first multilingual support line for emotional support and resources
- **CATT Program -** (Community Assessment Treatment and Transport) - Assisted Alameda County/San Leandro Police with the soft opening
- **FLEX RIDES -** Revamping free shuttle and ride program

Housing Assistance

Local Eviction Moratorium –

- protection from eviction for residential and commercial renters who are not able to pay rent due to COVID-19 related loss in income.
- Tenant Assistance \$45,000
 - Landlord/Tenant Counseling & **Renter Legal Assistance**
- Emergency Rental Asst. Program \$1.2 mil (federal CDBG-Covid-19 stimulus funding)



HELP MAY BEAVAILABLE Emergency Rental Assistance grants are available for San Leandro tenants experiencing COVID-19 economic hardship.

Business Assistance

- Outdoor Facilities Program temporarily waived requirements to set up a free and streamlined program for businesses to operate outdoors
- Limit on Third-Party Food Delivery Fees
 - fees charged to restaurants by delivery companies capped at 15%
- Keeping it Local Campaign with Chamber & partners
- **COVID-19 Business Resource Page** & info sharing via social media, email
- Case-by Case Consultation re: available resources, health regulations
- Civil Unrest Response & Assistance



Business Grants to Date

- San Leandro Small Business Continuity Grant 310 Applicants
 - \$300,000 in \$5,000 Grants = 60 grants
 - \$250,000 from City, \$50,000 from East Bay Community Energy

Alameda Co CARES Small Business Grant – 660 Applicants

- San Leandro Pool \$300,000 = 60 grants
 - \$150,000 from City
 - \$150,000 County CARES Fund Match
- ^{**D**} Co. Pool = \$670,000 = **134 grants**
- 466 Businesses who applied did not receive a grant



Alameda County **CARES** Grant

Recommendation

- Appropriate \$400,000 in General Fund Reserves for businesses who applied for Alameda County Grants
- 80 additional \$5,000 grants
- City staff administer in same manner as County Grant

Available Funding

- Sufficient General Fund Reserves Available
- Goal of Reserves: assist in times of economic uncertainty
- Business Closures have negative impact on local economy, unemployment, and personal finances and lives of small business owners and disadvantaged individuals
- One time expenditure to help businesses make it through 2021 and move towards recovery
