How we started?

- Founded in 1976, we have provided **49 years** of community service!
- Began as a grassroots effort by Tri-Cities women who recognized domestic violence was occurring and stepped up to meet the needs of survivors in the community.
- We started with an all volunteer staff in a 6-bed donated house and have grown to 24 full time staff, a 24 bed safe house and a range of comprehensive services designed to meet the needs of survivors where ever they are in their journey.



SAVE's Programs & Services

Crisis Response Services



- 24-hour crisis line
- Walk-in services at our Empowerment Center
- Emergency motel stays
- Assistance with food, transportation and other emergency needs.
- Temporary restraining order assistance, court accompaniment
- 300 languages through 24/7 translation service

Empowerment Center



Safe House



- Low barrier entry, rapid response
- A large home for 24 residents - both families and single survivors
- Communal living with shared bedrooms and common spaces.
- Services include: case management, peer counseling and traditional therapy, assistance securing permanent housing

DV Housing First Programs



- Mariposa Project (HUD funded rapid rehousing)
- CalOES funded Housing First services:
 - Move-in costs and rent subsidies
 - Assistance with utility bills
 - Help with car repairs, gas and public transit
 - Emergency food, clothing and household needs

Community Education

- Multi-day prevention education curricula
- Youth leadership development
- Consultation and training services
- Youth group development/training



SAVE serves San Leandro survivors



- SAVE serves about 90 San Leandro survivors each year.
- CAP grant supports the front-end emergency services provided by the Crisis Response Team - 24-hour response, immediate shelter, food and clothing, safety planning
- Connections to longer term services such as placement in Safe House, ongoing case management, therapy.
- Crisis Response staff receive and review DV reports from SLPD and reach out to survivors to offer services and support.

Community Education in San Leandro



- SAVE's Community Education team will deliver 30 Healthy Relationship and Violence Prevention presentations to community groups and schools serving San Leandro residents.
- SAVE will facilitate 8 Peer Educator trainings targeting San Leandro youth leaders and youth-serving organizations. The program will engage young people who are already active in clubs, advocacy, or community efforts to maximize peer influence.
- In collaboration with community organizations, SAVE will organize the participation in one community event focused on violence prevention. This event may include an outreach booth, exhibition, art show, or public
