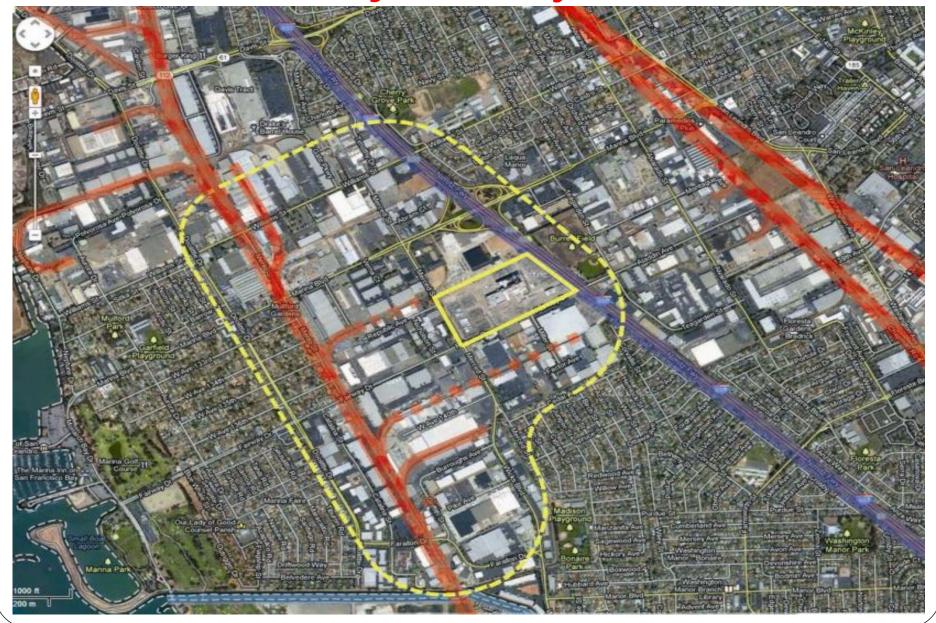
Opportunities for the Central Industrial Area from the Study

- Regional visibility as a Center of Innovation
- Create a unique and vibrant "place"
- Stimulate private investment, business attraction & jobs
- Modernize the infrastructure and development pattern
- Develop regulatory adaptability/flexibility

Existing Constraints for the Central Industrial Area

- 20th century "superblocks"
- Aging buildings
- Auto-oriented access
- Lack of talent-attraction amenities such as restaurants/cafes
- Real and perceived obstacles for development

Recommendation

- Benefits to City
 - Study is less costly and time-consuming vs specific plan
 - Time is of the essence
 - Guidance for upcoming Zoning Code amendments & GP Update
 - Helps City focus in on an effective "narrative" to attract next generation businesses & private investment
 - Capitalize on Lit San Leandro and its expansion
- Staff recommends approval of the contract for \$90,000 to Freedman Tung + Sasaki
