WHEREAS, Congress declared March as Women's History Month in 1987, and International Women's Day has been observed since the early 1900s; and


WHEREAS, women of every race, class, and ethnic background have made meaningful contributions to the growth and strength of our San Leandro community and to the United States in countless ways; and


