

POWERS AND DUTIES

The Committee shall advise staff and the Council on matters related to the status and condition of bicycles and pedestrians within the City. In discharge of this responsibility, the Committee shall:

- (a) Advise staff and the Council on the development and updates of the Transportation Element of the General Plan and the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan;
- (b) Provide citizen oversight on the implementation of San Leandro Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan;
- (c) Recommend project development funding and priorities;
- (d) Assist staff in reviewing implementation plans;
- (e) Participate in outreach and educational efforts;
- (f) Provide comments on pending legislation affecting bicycle and pedestrian travel within the City;
- (g) Advocating for City projects that improve bike and pedestrian infrastructure.
