PURPOSE

Resolution 2011-011 was passed in 2011 for the establishment of the Bicycle Pedestrian Advisory Committee (BPAC).

Formalize BPAC as a commission in consistent with other commissions into the:

- 1) San Leandro Municipal Code
- 2) San Leandro Administrative Code

TERM OF OFFICE

Members appointed pursuant to Section 1-3-110 may hold office up to four (4) years. District Members shall terminate upon the expiration of the regular term of the Council Member representing the Council Member District from which the District Member was appointed.



POWERS AND DUTIES

The Committee shall advise staff and the Council on matters related to the status and condition of bicycles and pedestrians within the City. In discharge of this responsibility, the Committee shall:

- (a) Advise staff and the Council on the development and updates of the Transportation Element of the General Plan and the Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan;
- (b) Provide citizen oversight on the implementation of San Leandro Bicycle and Pedestrian Master Plan;
- (c) Recommend project development funding and priorities;
- (d) Assist staff in reviewing implementation plans;
- (e) Participate in outreach and educational efforts;
- (f) Provide comments on pending legislation affecting bicycle and pedestrian travel within the City;
- (g) Advocating for City projects that improve bike and pedestrian infrastructure.





STAFF RECOMMENDATION

1. Formalize BPAC by including the commission into the Municipal Code and Administrative Code
2. Introduce for First Reading at December 4 City Council Meeting
3. Approve at December 18 City Council Meeting
