## Highlights of Financial Challenges

- Unfunded deferred maintenance, capital projects, and infrastructure needs
  - Significant road repair needs
- Lean staffing levels
- Public Safety Needs
  - Fire station modernizations
  - Fire Dept. vehicles & medical equipment

# Background

SL voters have authorized 6 tax measures over the past decade:

## Measure Z (November 2010)

¼ cent sales tax, 7-year sunset to expire 12/31/2017

## Measure HH (November 2014)

- Extended Measure Z at  $\frac{1}{2}$  cent rate, 30-year sunset to expire  $\frac{12}{31}/\frac{2044}$
- Maintained existing service levels

## Measures OO, PP, NN (November 2016)

- Small business license tax reduction, parking lot (10% of gross receipts) & warehouse tax (\$100/\$1,000 square feet)
- Modified T.O.T (hotel tax) from 10% to 14%
- Cannabis business tax (currently 5% of gross receipts)

## Measure VV (November 2020)

Increased real property transfer tax from \$6/\$1,000 to \$11/\$1,000

# Background (cont'd)

## July 10, 2023:

- Council presented with various revenue measure options
- Council directs staff to explore a 2024 measure

#### December 2023:

- Scientific survey conducted
  - 3 measures tested:
    - · G.O. bond
    - Parcel Tax
    - UUT

# Highlights of survey results

**Favorability rating of city services:** 67.3%

#### **Highlights of Top-Ranked Service Priorities**

- Repair potholes and maintain City streets
- Maintain neighborhood police patrols
- Maintain youth violence prevention, and drug and gang intervention programs
- Upgrade Fire stations to ensure rapid emergency response
- Enhance senior and youth programs
- Keeping City parks clean and safe, and
- Support recreation programs

## Survey results ("informed support")\*:

Parcel Tax: 62.1%

GO Bond: 60%

UUT: 52.4%

\*Sample size: n= 700

Margin of error: 3.66% - likely Nov. 2024 voters; 6.39% for split samples

# Key Take-aways

- Utility User Tax is most viable
  - 3.4% increase could generate b/t \$6.8M to \$7.1M annually

#### **Top-Ranked Service Priorities**

- Repair potholes and maintain City streets
- Maintain neighborhood police patrols
- Maintain youth violence prevention, and drug and gang intervention programs
- Upgrade fire stations to ensure rapid emergency response
- Enhance senior and youth programs
- Keeping City parks clean and safe
- Recreation programs

## Recommendations

- Focus on proposed UUT measure
- Continue to conduct public outreach
- Continue to communicate the City's "story of need"
- Consider bonding against future proceeds
- Conduct additional tracking poll this spring/summer
- Authorize proposed agreement
