# AQUATICS

**Family Swim Passes have been a huge hit this year:**

- 115 Families (456 individuals) – and still selling! = \$18,507
- Last year 51 families purchased passes (with 231 individual passes issued) = \$8,421

# ***YOUTH ACTIVITIES***

**Chabot Day Camp is underway!** Both sessions of Big Trees are full, Driftwood is full, and one session of Little Trees is full (that's 252 registered campers!)

**Summer Adventures:** Registration increased 25% from last year – 70 last week

**Youth Sports:** Added two new Camps – Volleyball and Basketball

**Specialty Camps:** Added new camps - Cooking, Drama and Creative writing, Spanish, Nature and Science

**Counselor in Training and Junior Counselors:** Added a CIT program for Summer Adventures

**Youth Employment:** Partnering with Eden Youth and Family Center to provide paid summer internship opportunities for at-risk youth (paid by EYFC)



# ***TINY TOTS***

**Our Tiny Tots programs are incredibly popular!**

Due to this, several exciting program additions are occurring:

We received a \$95K grant from First 5 Alameda County – in partnership with the library – to offer bilingual Spanish programs. Our department will be adding a bilingual Kiddie Kollege program at Halcyon Park and the Main Branch. The grant is for 2 years, with a likely 2 year continuation.

A third Kindergarten Readiness class is scheduled for this fall at the Washington Manor Park building.

# SAN LEANDRO SENIOR COMMUNITY CENTER

- The Senior Community Center serves an average of 5,315 people per month in a variety of capacities.
- Over 3,000 students have taken a Fall Prevention class since January 2013. Fall Prevention is one of our most successful classes and is offered 4x/week, in partnership with Spectrum Community Services and partially funded through Measure A grant funds.
- Senior Swingers meet each Wednesday afternoon, during their new and improved hours: 1:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. Approximately 100 dancers come together to Waltz, Fox Trot, Rumba and Tango.
- Paratransit: FLEX and Medical Rides increased 36% from 2011/12-2012/13

***PARKS RESERVATIONS GO ONLINE!*** As of January 2013, parks can be reserved online. 20% of our rentals so far have been online!

**Marina Community Center Reservations:** From 2011/12 to 2012/13, reservations have increased by 20% and revenues increased by 26%
