4.A. City-wide Updates

The City of San Leandro is developing the Fiscal Year 2025-26 & 2026-27 Budget and is conducting engagement forums to get input from the community. These are scheduled for February 27th at the Marina Community Center from 6:00-8:00 p.m., March 1st from 9:30-11:30 at the Surlene Grant Community Room, and virtually on April 29th from 1:00-3:00 p.m.

This year's State of the City Address is scheduled for March 18th at 6:00 p.m. at the Senior Community Center.

The Recreation and Parks Master Plan Draft is under staff review and scheduled to go to the Facilities Committee and Recreation and Parks Commission in March.

Commissioners Comelo, Lopez Nacario, and Peña were appointed to another term during the Tuesday, February 18th City Council meeting.

4.B. Human Services Department-wide Updates

The Lewelling Interim Housing and Drop-in Center will open in late February. The Human Services Department will host an "open house" in the late spring/summer for commissioners and other key stakeholders.

There are upcoming meetings scheduled with San Leandro Unified School District and the San Leandro Boys & Girls Club regarding intergenerational programming. Naranjo shared a relevant update with the Plan's personal

protections priority regarding passage of AB 413 (Intersection Daylighting law). The City produced a video to educate the public. Naranjo will share it with the Commission. Commissioners shared relevant comments, questions and ideas.

Mike King led a discussion regarding the Commission's recommendations for priorities and implementation of projects during the five-year Plan's timeline.
