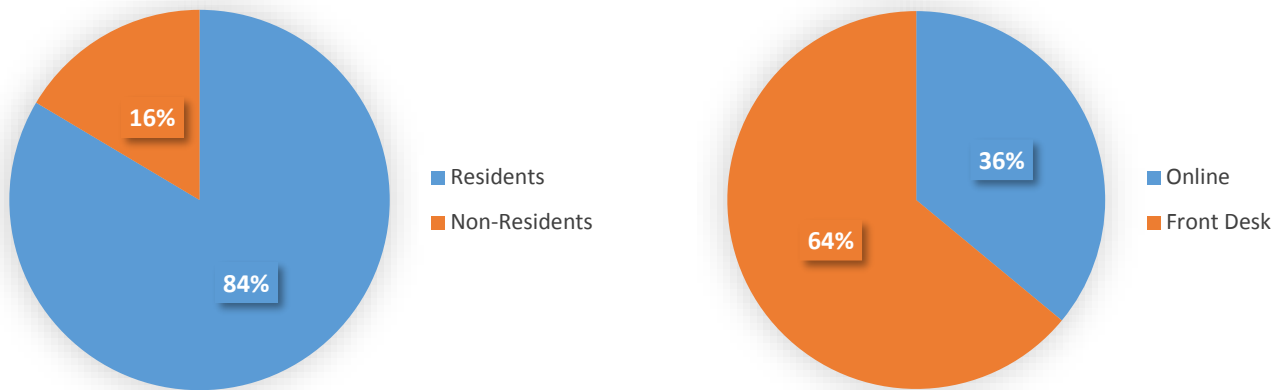

Program Highlights

Camp Hooty Hoo

Camp Hooty Hoo introduced an environmental/conservation education component and stewardship program. During each session, participants had the exclusive opportunity to receive creek education, which took place alongside the San Leandro Creek. During these lessons, participants had the opportunity to explore the creek, learn about creek history, and the importance of the creek to the local watershed.

As part of the effort to create stewardship amongst campers, all 250 campers were ‘sworn in’ as “Little Trouts” or Jr. Creek Stewards. Each Jr. Steward received a badge and certificate of recognition of their new role. As part of this new role, Little Trouts pledged to contribute to the health and preservation of the SL Creek.

Senior Travel Troupe Day Trips for Adults 50+

Summer 2017 showcased a variety of trips that had seniors enjoying the summer sun with long days and cool nights. Trips included:

Cache Creek Lavender Farm & Casino – 38 travelers visited the family-owned farm located at the edge of Rumsey in Capay Valley

Tamber Bey Winery & Downtown Calistoga – 31 travelers visited Sundance Ranch, a world-class equestrian facility dedicated to training top performance horses. Travelers sampled wine, mingled with the horses, and enjoyed the views of Mount St. Helena.

La Cage Aux Folles – 38 travelers explored and enjoyed a night out in San Francisco where they capped the night with a once in a lifetime musical experience.

Summer Aquatics Program

Over 1,000 swimming lessons and water exercise programs were taught at three pool sites – Boys and Girls Club, San Leandro Family Aquatic Center, and San Leandro High School.

Swimming lessons at the San Leandro High School Pool were very successful, with an average of 130 swimmers each day.

The Boys and Girls Club Pool had an average of 400 guests entering the facility daily. The San Leandro Family Aquatic Center welcomed over 5,000 customers weekly, with the facility reaching capacity during Recreational Swim 68 out of 79 days. Swim Lessons at the San Leandro High School Pool were very successful, raking in an average of 130 swimmers each day.

Event Highlights

Summer Movie Nights

Every other Wednesday from June 14 – July 26 and on Saturday, August 19 popular family-friendly movies were shown at City Parks.

Movies, including The Secret Life of Pets, Sing, Finding Nemo, Finding Dory, and Moana were shown at Washington Manor Park, Halcyon Park and Bonaire Park. **Attendance averaged 75-100 people.**

Family Fun Recreational Swim

Three Fridays in July, the San Leandro Aquatic Center hosted carnival themed recreational swims. These events included a photo booth, snack bar, games, and an appearance by Captain Splash. Those individuals that pre-registered for the event received a reduced entry fee. **A total of 122 customers pre-registered for the swim event and more than 450 paid the drop-in fee the day of.**
