BRIEF HISTORY & PRIORITIES OF EDEN HEALTH DISTRICT

- Established in 1948 to build Eden Medical Center and later acquired San Leandro Hospital
- Serves the 350,000 residents of Castro Valley, Hayward, Fairview, San Leandro, San Lorenzo, Ashland and Cherryland
- Elected board of five members: Chair Mariellen Faria, Vice-Chair Pam Russo,
 Secretary-Treasurer Roxann Lewis, Gordon Galvan, Varsha Chauhan
- Has received no tax revenue since 1976
- Owns Two Medical Office Buildings
 - Eden Medical Office Building in Castro Valley
 - Dublin Gateway Building in Dublin
- Affiliated with Baywood Court Retirement Community in Castro Valley
- Contributed over \$30 M to St. Rose Hospital and San Leandro Hospital and non-profits including medical clinics, senior programs and food program

MISSION AND VISION OF EDEN HEALTH DISTRICT

- Our mission is to improve the health of the community by providing access to direct and indirect care services and health education.
- We prioritize improving the health outcomes of our most vulnerable residents by working closely with community and public agencies through prevention, health education, and rapid response to emerging threats.

- Through research of health systems within the district and public health data we have identified priority areas in need as south Hayward, and unincorporated areas of Ashland/Cherryland and San Lorenzo.
- Our testing and vaccination pandemic efforts have focused in those areas while disseminating health information throughout the District..

- Created community partnerships and acted as healthcare advisors for COVID-19 clinics
- Ongoing grants and community support






EARLY COMMITMENT TO OBTAINING AND DISTRIBUTING PPE – PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT



California Becomes First State to Require School Teachers/Staff to Get Vaccinated Or Tested Weekly

California will become the first state in the nation to require all teachers and school staff to get vaccinated or undergo weekly COVID-19 testing.

The statewide vaccine mandate for K-12 educators comes as schools return from summer break amid growing concerns of the highly contagious Delta variant.

Democratic Gov. Gavin Newsom announced the new policy Wednesday as he visited a San Francisco Bay Area school that has already reopened after summer break. Many California schools are back in session, with others starting in the coming weeks. Several large school districts in the state have issued similar requirements in recent days, including San Francisco, Oakland, San Jose and the Long Beach Unified school districts. **AP** Read more

More Places Are Requiring Proof Of COVID-19 Vaccination

Hospitals and nursing homes in California must now verify that visitors are vaccinated or have tested negative for the coronavirus within the last three days, the Golden State's latest COVID requirement amid a pandemic with no end in sight.

The shift could offer another indication of things to come as hospitals pivot from screening visitors for symptoms to checking vaccination cards and QR codes. With the Delta variant surging across the state and employers from Facebook to the federal government now mandating workers get vaccinated, an increasing number of businesses from bars to concert halls are barring the unvaccinated. Is California finally on the cusp of adopting a vaccine passport?




