- Identifying residential, employment, and transportation patterns of low-income and minority populations so that their needs may be identified and addressed in our regional planning process;
- Integrating into our activities an analytical process that identifies the benefits and burdens of our investments on different socioeconomic groups, identifying imbalances and responding to the analyses produced;
- Promoting full and fair participation of individuals in low income and minority communities in planning and programming decisions;
- Ensuring meaningful access to programs, services, and activities by persons with limited English proficiency (LEP); and

## TITLE VI COMPLAINT PROCEDURE

As a recipient of federal dollars, the City of San Leandro is required to comply with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 and ensure that services and benefits are provided on a non-discriminatory basis. The City of San Leandro has in place a Title VI Complaint Procedure, which outlines a process for local disposition of Title VI complaints and is consistent with guidelines found in the Federal Transit Administration Circular 4702.1A dated May 13, 2007.

If you believe you have been discriminated against, you may file a signed, written complaint within one hundred and eighty (180) days of the date of the alleged discrimination. The complaint should include the following information:

- 1. Your name, address, and how to contact you (e.g., telephone number, e-mail address, etc.)
- 2. Complaints shall state, as fully as possible, the facts and circumstances surrounding the alleged discrimination: how, when, where and why you believe you were discriminated against. Include the location, names, and contact information of any witnesses.
- 3. All complaints must be signed by the complainant or his/her representative.
