City Council Goals

- Place the City on a firm foundation for long-term fiscal sustainability
- ➤ Maintain and enhance the City's infrastructure
- Support and implement programs...that enhance the quality of life and wellness, celebrates the arts and diversity and promotes civic pride

What is the Consolidated Plan?



- ➤ Five-Year Strategic Plan (July 1, 2015 June 30, 2020)
- Identifies long-term housing & community development needs
- Establishes strategies for addressing these priority needs
- Sets performance goals to measure success
- Determines funding priorities for the City's federal CDBG and HOME programs

What is the Consolidated Plan?(cont'd)

- Annual Action Plan
 - Describes CDBG & HOME funding allocations and strategies to implement Five-Year Consolidated Plan for the coming year
 - Required by HUD to receive annual entitlement grant
- Consolidated Annual Performance & Evaluation Report (CAPER)
 - Assesses the City's performance in meeting the goals, objectives and actions proposed under the Annual Action Plan approved for the previous year

What is the Consolidated Plan?(cont'd)



- ➤ The Consolidated Plan <u>is not related</u> to the City's General Plan Update & 2015-2023 Housing Element
 - General Plan Update & Housing Element are State-mandated
 - Consolidated Plan is HUD-mandated to receive annual CDBG funds
- Encourages citizen participation
- > Submitted to Alameda County HOME Consortium
- > HUD's Integrated Disbursement & Information System (IDIS)
 - Consolidated Plan, Action Plans, and CAPERS are submitted online through IDIS Online System

Citizen Participation

- Conducted two community meetings (January 20th & 28th) to receive public input on the City's priority needs
- **➤** Community meeting outreach included:
 - Flyers posted in City Hall, Main Library, Marina Community Center and Senior Community Center
 - > Email notices and mailings to CDBG distribution list
 - City website posting
 - Published notices in San Leandro Times

Citizen Participation (cont'd)

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Priority Needs Survey

- Distributed at the community meetings
- Sent to CDBG distribution list
- Posted on City website (SurveyMonkey.com)
- > 33 completed surveys received (6 hardcopies; 27 on-line)
- Survey results highest needs as:
 - Increase availability of and preserve existing affordable rental housing
 - Preserve existing homeownership
 - Prevent those currently housed from becoming homeless
 - > Economic Development

Priority Needs

- ➤ The Consolidated Plan is divided into four (4) Priority Needs:
 - > 1. Affordable Housing
 - > 2. Homelessness
 - > 3. Supportive Housing
 - > 4. Community Development Needs, includes:
 - > Capital Improvements
 - > Public Services
 - > Economic Development

Priority: **Housing Needs**



- ➤ Increase AVAILABILITY of affordable <u>rental</u> housing
- > Preserve **EXISTING** affordable <u>rental</u> housing
- > Preserve **EXISTING** ownership
- ➤ Assist First-Time Homebuyers
- Reduce Housing Discrimination

Priority: Homeless/Supportive Housing Needs

- ➤ Maintain, improve, and expand the capacity of housing, shelter, and services including integrated healthcare services, employment services, and other services
- ➤ Maintain and expand activities designed to prevent those currently housed from becoming homeless
- ➤ Build on inter-jurisdictional cooperation to achieve housing and homeless needs
- ➤ Increase the availability of service-enriched housing for persons with special needs (Supportive Housing Need)

Priority: Community Development (Non-Housing) Needs

- Capital Improvements
 - > Senior facilities and services
 - > Parks and recreation facilities
 - Neighborhood facilities
 - Childcare facilities and services
 - Crime awareness (prevention)
 - Accessibility needs
 - > Infrastructure improvements
- > Public Services
- > Economic Development

FY 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan



- > CDBG entitlement grant: \$628,306 (\$63K, 9% reduction)
- Proposed FY 2015-2016 CDBG Activities
 - > Public Services (\$94,245 limit based on 15% cap)*

FY 2015-2016 Annual Action Plan (cont'd)



- Proposed FY 2015-2016 HOME Activities
 - ► HOME grant amount: \$141,964 (\$11,000, or 7%, reduction)
 - > \$433,772 carryover funds from previous fiscal years
 - > Total HOME funds available for FY 2015-2016: \$575,636
 - > Targeted for acquisition, new construction and/or rehabilitation of affordable rental housing, and tenant-based rental assistance
