#### HISTORY & TIMELINE OF EVENTS

- March 1, 2017: Mobilitie Presentation to Facilities Committee
- October 15, 2017: Governor Jerry Brown Vetoes SB 649
- Nov 2017 May 2018 (Approx): City Staff Negotiate Master License Agreements with Mobilitie, then ExteNet. AT&T begins negotiations.
- September 17, 2018: City Staff present Draft MLAs; City Council votes to send back to Facilities Committee
- September 26, 2018: FCC Adopts Declaratory Ruling on Small Cell Deployments
- November 14, 2018: Facilities Committee Meeting (Today)



### FCC Order: New Regulations

#### "Shot Clock" Rules:

- Collocation of small wireless facilities: 60 days
- Collocation of facilities other than small wireless facilities: 90 days.
- Construction of new small wireless facilities: 90 days
- Construction of new facilities other than small wireless facilities: 150 days.

### FCC Order: Declaratory Ruling

- ▶ What is it? FCC's interpretation of the 1934 Federal Communications Act that limits state or local regulations
- ► What does it do? Provides guidance on fees local governments may charge and how they may regulate issues such as tower spacing, equipment design and other aesthetic concerns.

### FCC Order: Impacts to City

- ▶ Have to comply with Shot Clocks
- Effectively cannot say "No" to future permit applications
- Annual pole attachment fees "safe harbor" limit = \$270/pole/year
- Cannot require "like kind" public benefits
- City could face legal risk if not compliant
- Must have aesthetic guidelines and other local regulations published when the Order goes into effect (Jan 2019)\*\*\*



# Update on Negotiations (City) & Legal Actions (National)

- Mobilitie has withdrawn from the Draft MLA
- AT&T has ended MLA negotiations
- Verizon is no longer pursuing an MLA negotiation
- ExteNet (present) is still willing to execute an MLA
- ▶ Legal Actions: As of 11/6/18, Federal Appeals Court is hearing consolidated cases



# Review of Draft Master License Agreement (MLA)

- Local Outreach Process for each Site License
- Market Rate for Pole Leases
  - \$2000/year/pole with 3% annual increase
- Access to Fiber/Backhaul, if installed by provider
- Design Guidelines for Aesthetics
- Protection for Municipal Infrastructure (WiFi, Climatec, etc)
- Open Access, Co-Location; First come, first serve
- Long term agreement length for mutually beneficial partnerships



### City Small Cell Antenna Ordinance

- Must have local regulations published by Jan 2019
- Must be consistent with FCC Order
- Can include: aesthetic requirements, including pre-approval of antenna, equipment cabinet and street furniture designs
- Fee Schedule, including standard encroachment permit fee
- Spacing, public outreach, municipal infrastructure protections
- Cannot be perceived as a barrier to deployment
- Carriers can still enter into negotiations, but City Staff must weigh time to develop those with benefits being offered
