OUR VISION


Davis Street's vision to help the low-income members of our community improve their quality of life through short and long-term assistance.

OUR MISSION



- Basic Needs provides clothing, food, utility and housing assistance to working-poor families and seniors.
- **Primary Care Clinic** offering medical, dental, pediatric, optometry, behavioral, and women's health services.
- Children's Services quality, affordable childcare through the parental choice voucher program (APP) and our 5 licensed childcare centers.
- **Stepping Stones** programs for individuals with developmental disabilities.

BACK TO SCHOOL BACK PACK AND SHOE GIVEAWAY

For over 15 years, the back to school giveaway has helped relieve low-income and homeless families of the burden of purchasing school supplies. The program provides new shoes, school supplies, and backpacks to nearly 500 homeless and low-income children in San Leandro in preparation of the upcoming school year.





BIKES FOR TYKES

For over 2 decades, Davis Street has partnered with the San Leandro Police Officers Association to give away new bicycles and helmets to underprivileged children in the San Leandro Community. Officer Louie Brandt led the program in partnership with Davis Street for 8 years, and this year, Abbott Diabetes Care Division adopted Davis Street to provide 1,000 children with new bikes and helmets. This year's bike distribution will be held on Saturday, December 14, 2019.







HOLIDAY BASKET PROGRAM






For 48 years, Davis Street, in collaboration with the Alameda County Fire Department, San Leandro Police Officers Association, local schools, clubs, faith-based communities, and businesses, has provided food baskets to more than 1,000 families throughout San Leandro, San Lorenzo, Ashland, Cherryland, and Castro Valley. The Holiday Basket Program provides families, and seniors with a holiday feast, a turkey, fresh produce, seasonal goods, and new toys and gift cards for the children.

STEPPING STONES

Providing critically needed services to 240 adults who live with developmental disabilities.



PROGRAMS INCLUDE:

- Artful Steps teaching individuals, of every level of ability, methods for self-expression through the visual arts. The program promotes the talent of our artists through community-based events.
- Steps Toward Wellness -The purpose of this programs is to enhance the quality of life by introducing the consumers to information and activities which will lead to healthier life styles





STEPPING STONES PROGRAMS CONTINUED

Hire Steps - a prevocational/remedial program designed for individuals who have not been previously employed or
who have a desire to work but are unsure of what it takes to become a successful employee. Hire Steps follows a
curriculum outlining the steps to become successful in the workplace with a focus on overcoming a variety of
barriers to employment.

• Independent Living Services – a program for those consumers who desire to live in their own housing, or are already living in their own housing and need ongoing assistance. The program offers training in areas deemed necessary for the individual, such as: cooking, money management, self-advocacy, communication, emergency procedures, laundry, shopping, and use of public transportation. In addition, the consumer will be assisted in applying for Section 8 housing

as well as searching for an apartment.

• Stepping Out – a mobility training service designed to both assess a consumer's aptitude to travel independently and to teach those consumers who can travel independently the best way to get to various places using public transportation.
