Proposed Project for 201 Foothill Blvd.

The project is to create a Spanish Immersion Child Care Center to serve 50 children from ages 2-5 years old. There is also an additional after school component for 20 school age children who would attend after the departure of 20 preschool kids making the total enrollment of 50 children at any given time.

Hours

The center will operate from 7am-7pm Monday Through Friday

**Employees** 

The center will employ 8-10 teachers and directors in the space working at different shifts where only 8 would be working at a given time with shifts starting at 645am and ending at 7pm for clean up.

Children

As a daycare with different hours here is the approximate kids by hours:

7-830 am 25 kids

845-3pm 50

3pm 20 preschool age kids leave

3-6pm 30 preschool age kids in center

330-6 20 school age children

Parking and Open space

Due to the space for outdoor needed by licensing we would need 75 square feet of outdoor space per child and therefore are proposing to use the front space for play space and have only street parking. The employees would be required to park across the street along the freeway side and the parents would be able to park along the front and side of the building for pick up and drop off.

The parents park and stay in the area during pick up and drop off for a maximum of 10 minutes and are staggered in their arrival in the morning between 7-9am and in the afternoon in a 3 hour window between 3-6pm.

#### Planting

As a core value of ours we teach children about planning and where food comes form we will have some planter boxes within the confines of the front outdoor space.

Shade structure will be with four posts commercially build see attached

Fence would be existing structure removing the points at the top and adding wood paneling to the existing fence for lack of visibility. Details on front of plans.

#### Background

In September 2011, La Plazita was born out of the two founder's need for a structured Spanish Immersion Preschool in the Oakland area for their children. They created a program taught entirely in Spanish with a robust curriculum that would put a child on the path to educational success for kindergarten and beyond. In March of 2013, the company quickly grew from a 12-capacity facility to add a second Preschool Center with an enrollment capacity of 45 children in the Laurel District of Oakland. Within two years, on August of 2015, another even larger center opened with a capacity of 110 children allowing them to close the smallest facility. The company currently runs two fully licensed preschools and one after school program serving over 250 children from the surrounding community.

#### Differentiation

La Plazita Preschool contributes to the shaping of behaviors in the most significant way being, that preschool is the child's first introduction into a world greater than their families. They learn how to balance their needs with that of the group as well as become a positive group contributor. Parents and educators are continually surprised with the level of Spanish that they hear from children of the La Plazita program. But even more so, they are surprised by the level of maturity and how prepared they are for kindergarten. At La Plazita, children learn how to be socially and emotionally prepared for the learning environment. In subsequent learning environments and even in relating to their own families, these skills are golden for kindergarten teachers. Many kindergarten teachers have visited La Plazita to find out what exactly we do to prepare children so well for their new learning environment.

#### Job Creation

Plazita Schools, Inc. has created 55 full time jobs in the local community. The company has a history of employing recent legal immigrants that have had a hard time finding full time careers that provide growth and management opportunities. La Plazita has promoted their managers from within and currently all senior managers have been with the company since its first year of business.

## Profitability

The company has strong financials and has always operated at a profit, even during expansion years. La Plazita took out one small micro-loan during its first year and had it paid in full before the maturity of

the loan. Since then, expansion has been fueled mostly by cash. The company took two small loans from conventional banks for the larger school. All loans are in good standing. The company currently has minimal debt and is looking to begin purchasing property to house the existing schools that are currently leased. The sales for this year are on track for over \$2,000,000.

## Expansion

Company growth is attributed to a strong curriculum based on substantiated theories of early childhood education. The company uses language immersion techniques that have been proven to create fluency as well as a social and emotional curriculum that prepares children for the learning environment. The company has invested only \$600 in advertising since 2011, and instead uses parents "word of mouth" as their most effective marketing. The schools currently fill up 8 months in advance.
