Identify Projects in need of funding

Solicit project ideas from City Council, City Staff, and Public.

- Council members and Department Heads can add projects to the database.
- Public can submit suggestions via City webpage or by completing a form available at the Engineering and Transportation booth at the Cherry Festival and town hall events.
- Suggestions for projects from City Staff and public are vetted by Department heads before being added to the list.

Ranking Projects in need of funding

Every budget cycle:

- CIP committee scores projects in 8 categories
- City Council sets weights for each category
- City Council comments on and approves rankings of the projects

Funded Projects

- 29 Projects proposed for funding will be fully funded except:
 - 1. Street Overlay / Rehab ~ \$10M shortfall
 - 2. Shoreline Park at the Marina ~ \$15M shortfall for full build out. Will be phased unless additional funds are identified.
 - 3. Fire Station Replacement project/funding is only for a study and initial design Construction is unfunded and included in the unfunded project list

Unfunded Projects

144 projects are on the unfunded list. These projects were not ranked highly enough to receive funding or were added after the last budget was approved.
