



OAK BACKGROUND AND ACTIVITY




Oakland International Airport

- Second busiest airport in the third largest
 U.S air service market
- In 2019 there were about 13.4 million passengers annually
- In May 2021, OAK served 45 nonstop destination, down from the high of 60 destinations.
- #1 air cargo airport in the Bay Area
- FedEx West Coast Cargo hub
- Powers nearly 60% of the more than 84,000 regional jobs generated by the Port






Passenger Levels at OAK




Immediate COVID Impacts

- Average 65% drop in annual passenger levels
- Port operating and capital budget cuts
- Newly approved food and beverage concessionaire program delayed
- Some capital projects put on hold
- Cancelled hotel development plans

Airport Perimeter Dike Project

- The perimeter dike separates OAK's South Field airfield from San Francisco Bay waters and protects the essential airfield and terminal facilities.
- We expect to be substantially complete by the end of the calendar year. The
 project will improve the dike for FEMA certification for a 100-year storm + 1' of sea
 level rise.





Taxiway Bravo Rehabilitation


- Pavement and lighting upgrades for critical taxiway at OAK, AIP grant funded (Approx. \$30M).
- Taxiway rehabilitation is essential to maintain safety operating standards and is usually conducted every 10-15 years.
- Construction began in May 2021 and is scheduled to be complete in November 2021.
- Project team worked diligently with the contractor to minimize operational and community noise impacts, although some impacts were unavoidable.





The OAK Terminal Modernization and Development

- Due to the age, condition, and size of the existing OAK terminals, development is needed to modernize OAK facilities, meet industry safety standards, improve operational efficiency, and accommodate an increase in passengers.
- Terminal 1 was constructed in 1962, and Terminal 2 was constructed in 1985.
- The terminals do not meet current industry standards and were not designed to serve the number of passengers using OAK prior to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The Port is proposing to modernize existing Terminals 1 and 2 and construct a new terminal to address facility safety, efficiency, and modernization needs.



The OAK Terminal Modernization and Development Project

The OAK Terminal Modernization and Development Project consists of:

- Modernization of existing Terminals 1 and 2, including:
 - Consolidation of passenger processing functions (ticketing, baggage handling, security)
 - Construction of expanded Customs and Border Protection facilities for international arrivals
- Construction of a new terminal
- Reconfiguration of existing cargo and support facilities
- Improvements to the roadway, parking areas, and support facilities



OAK Terminal Modernization & Development CEQA Process



- Completed public comment period
- Preparing Draft EIR documentation
- Anticipate release of DEIR in Fall 2022


