Resolution Overruling Protests (2012 Business License Tax, Solid Waste Service Charges, Sidewalk Repairs, Community Compliance Code Enforcement Violation Penalties and/or Weed Abatement Charges, False Alarm Responses, Certified Unified Program Agencies (CUPA) Fees, and Sewer Service Charges)

The City Council of the City of San Leandro has conducted a public hearing on the assessments proposed to be levied for non-payment of delinquent 2012 business license tax, solid waste service charges, sidewalk repairs, community compliance code enforcement violation penalties and/or weed abatement charges, false alarm responses, Certified Unified Program Agencies (CUPA) fees, and Sewer Service charges, said hearing conducted at 7:00 p.m. on July 16, 2012 in the City Council Chambers, City Hall, 835 East 14th Street, San Leandro, CA 94577.
