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RESOLUTION of the City of San Leandro City Council to Approve a Consulting Services Agreement with Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. for the Design Work of the Wicks Boulevard and Manor Boulevard Signal Upgrade Project in the Amount of \$83,859, to Appropriate \$42,359 from the Development Fees for Street Improvements Fund Balance and to Authorize the City Manager to Negotiate and Execute Individual Contract Amendments up to 10% (\$8,386) and Cumulative Amendments up to a Maximum of 25% (\$20,965)

WHEREAS, the City was awarded 2018 Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) grant funds to upgrade the traffic signal at the Wicks Boulevard and Manor Boulevard intersection; and

WHEREAS, proposals were sought from consultants who specialize in design of traffic signals; and

WHEREAS, after reviewing proposals from three consultants, staff recommends that Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc. should be retained for design services for the traffic signal in the amount of \$83,859; and

WHEREAS, staff recommends the City Council authorize the City Manager to negotiate and approve Individual Contract Amendments up to 10% (\$8,386) and Cumulative Amendments up to a maximum of 25% (\$20,965); and

WHEREAS, a Consulting Services Agreement for Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., a copy of which is attached, is presented to this City Council; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is familiar with the contents of the agreement; and

WHEREAS, the City Manager recommends approval of said agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City Council of the City of San Leandro does RESOLVE as follows:

That said agreement is hereby approved and execution by the City Manager is hereby authorized; and

That \$42,359 in local matching funds from Development Fees for Street Improvements (DFSI) fund balance reserves (Fund 120) shall be used to appropriate funds in to account 120-38-349-5240 for Fiscal Year 2020-21; and

That the City Manager or his designee is authorized to negotiate and approve individual contract amendments up to 10% (\$8,386) and cumulative amendments up to a maximum of 25% (\$20,965).
